WHEREAS, JACKIE FREITAS enjoys engaging students in outdoor activities and providing project-based experiences that contribute to the well-being and enhancement of the Hawaiian community through environmental activism; and

WHEREAS, JACKIE FREITAS is a passionate educator committed to leading by example, who understands the importance of preparing students with real-world skills that extend beyond the classroom; and

WHEREAS, LAURIE CHANG was recently named the Honolulu District Kaimukī-McKinley-Roosevelt Complex Area 2024 Teacher of the Year; and

WHEREAS, LAURIE CHANG has demonstrated a deep passion for teaching and learning while inspiring the students of Ali'iolani Elementary School to strive for excellence; and

WHEREAS, LAURIE CHANG received a Bachelor of Science in fashion design, Professional Diploma in elementary education, and certification in special education from the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa; and
