HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO ADOPT A POLICY RELATING TO COMMUNITY SCHOOLS TO GUIDE THE ESTABLISHMENT OF ADDITIONAL COMMUNITY SCHOOLS THROUGHOUT THE STATE.

1 WHEREAS, every child should be given the opportunity to obtain a high-quality education; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, community schools provide comprehensive programs 5 and services to meet the unique needs of students and families, including a lack of stable housing, inadequate medical and 6 7 dental care, persistent hunger, trauma, and exposure to violence; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, according to a report from the Learning Policy Institute, the four key pillars of a community-schools approach 11 to education are integrated student supports, expanded and 12 enriched learning time and opportunities, active family 13 engagement, and collaborative leadership; and 14 15 WHEREAS, according to the national Coalition for Community 16 Schools, best practice shows that having a dedicated, full-time 17 Community School Coordinator who facilitates the alignment of 18 school, family, and community resources is a core element of a 19 20 successful community school; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the community school strategy aligns with the 23 Department of Education's Nā Hopena A'o Framework, strengthening the sense of belonging, responsibility, excellence, aloha, and 24 25 total well-being; and 26 WHEREAS, practices embodied in community schools promote 27 28 conditions found in high-quality schools nationwide, especially 29 with regard to overcoming out-of-school barriers to learning; 30 and 31

WHEREAS, research shows that community-school interventions 1 2 can result in improvements to a variety of student outcomes, 3 including attendance, academic achievement, and graduation 4 rates; and 5 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Consolidated State Plan under the Every 6 Student Succeeds Act includes community schools as a research 7 based strategy for school improvement that emphasizes high-8 quality teaching, culturally relevant curricula, wraparound 9 student supports, positive disciplinary practices and 10 11 restorative justice, parent and community engagement, and inclusive school leadership; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, community schools programs are already operating 15 in many parts of the State, especially in remote, rural, and 16 economically disadvantaged areas and more students and their families could benefit from an expansion of community schools; 17 18 now, therefore, 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 21 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 22 Session of 2024, that the Board of Education is requested to 23 adopt a policy relating to community schools; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 26 urged to use the policy adopted by the Board of Education to quide the expansion of community schools programs to additional 27 28 campuses; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of 31 Education and Superintendent of Education. 32 33 34 35 Au OFFERED BY:
