## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE INSURANCE COMMISSIONER TO COORDINATE AND DEVELOP A WILDFIRE INSURANCE COMPACT.

WHEREAS, the State is facing the increasing challenge of
 wildfires, which has been exacerbated by climate change that is
 responsible for more intense and more frequent extreme events
 such as wildfires, storms, droughts, and floods; and

6 WHEREAS, wildfires pose significant risks to the health,
7 safety, and welfare of the State's residents, visitors, and
8 businesses; and

10 WHEREAS, on August 8, 2023, swift moving wildfires fueled 11 by dry grass and spread by strong winds from a passing hurricane 12 wiped out almost the entire town of Lahaina in west Maui, in the 13 nation's deadliest wildfire in more than a century; and 14

WHEREAS, at least one hundred fifteen people lost their life in the fire, over two thousand two hundred buildings were destroyed and another five hundred damaged, resulting in property losses in the billions; and

20 WHEREAS, the impacts from the Lahaina wildfires were 21 devasting to the west Maui community and, with impacts felt 22 throughout the entire State; and

24 WHEREAS, the recovery is expected to be long and arduous; 25 and

WHEREAS, the aftermath of the deadly Lahaina wildfires
poses a significant strain on local insurance companies and
communities; and

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31 WHEREAS, there are concerns that the wildfires could32 trigger insurance companies to reevaluate the risks associated



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1 with offering coverage to homeowners in Hawaii, which has long been considered a relatively stable market compared to other 2 states; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the increased risk of wildfires and the resulting 5 challenges for insurance companies means the State should 6 explore a coordinated approach to mitigate and manage these 7 risks; now, therefore, 8 9 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 11 Session of 2024, that the Insurance Commissioner is requested to 12 coordinate and develop a Wildfire Insurance Compact with 13 strategic partner states that have similar wildfire risks or 14 robust disaster management systems; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Insurance Commissioner is 17 requested to develop a Wildfire Insurance Compact that focuses 18 19 primarily on risk pooling and informational technology sharing 20 to mitigate and share the risks and costs associated with 21 wildfires; and 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Insurance Commissioner is requested to propose any necessary legislation that can assist 24 25 in the funding of policies and programs available through the Wildfire Insurance Compact through taxes or surcharges on 26 27 existing taxes; and 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Insurance Commissioner is 29 requested to ensure that the policies and programs offered by 30 the Wildfire Insurance Compact directly benefit vulnerable 31 32 populations and communities; and 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 35 Resolution be transmitted to the Insurance Commissioner. 36 37 38 OFFERED BY:

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
