HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO EXAMINE THE FEASIBILITY OF A STATE LOTTERY.

WHEREAS, according to the North American Association of 1 State and Provincial Lotteries, forty-four states and the 2 District of Columbia offer lotteries in the United States; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Gallup polls have found that state lotteries are 5 the most popular form of gambling in the United States, with 6 roughly half of respondents saying they purchased a lottery 7 8 ticket in the past twelve months; and 9 WHEREAS, in 2021, Americans spent \$105.26 billion on 10 lottery tickets, and state governments on average take in about 11 a third of each lottery jackpot in taxes and revenue; and 12 13 WHEREAS, according to the Tax Foundation, "state lotteries 14 pay out an average of only 60 percent of gross revenues in 15 prizes (compared to about 90 percent for casino slot machines or 16 table games)"; and 17 18 WHEREAS, Hawaii is one of the few remaining jurisdictions 19 without a state lottery; and 20 21 WHEREAS, a working group should be convened to study 22 23 whether the a state lottery would be feasible; now, therefore, 24 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 25 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 26 Session of 2024, that the Department of Business, Economic 27 Development, and Tourism is requested to convene a working group 28 to examine the feasibility of a state lottery; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Business, 31 Economic Development, and Tourism submit a report of its 32
