A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PESTICIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that pesticide exposure 2 can cause significant harm to public health and the environment. 3 Restricted use pesticides have been deemed to have a high 4 potential to cause harm to surrounding communities, farm 5 workers, pollinators, the environment, and other crops. As 6 such, comprehensive pesticide use data is essential to 7 accurately assess risks and ensure that communities are 8 protected from adverse impacts.

9 The legislature further finds that Act 45, Session Laws of 10 Hawaii 2018, established requirements intended to address 11 pesticide abuse in Hawaii, including requiring all users of restricted use pesticides to annually report on their use of 12 13 restricted use pesticides to the department of agriculture. 14 However, robust and meaningful analysis of environmental and 15 public health impacts of pesticides is contingent on more 16 comprehensive reporting.

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1 The legislature also finds that currently, users are 2 required to report the address, tax map key, and location of the 3 application site but are not required to provide specific 4 geospatial data that could provide comprehensive mapping of 5 pesticide impacts. This poses difficulties to communities who 6 live adjacent to large tracts of agricultural land. According 7 to the state sponsored Joint Fact Finding Group study, Pesticide 8 Use by Large Agribusinesses on Kaua'i (2016), "more information 9 is needed about the time and place of applications along with 10 greater oversight to ensure compliance on all Islands. Again, 11 California appears to lead the nation in studies of chronic 12 health effects and/or associations with pesticide use. They are able to reach this level of scientific inquiry because they 13 14 require careful reporting of pesticide applications that specify 15 what was sprayed, where, when, and in what quantities." 16 Improved reporting in Hawaii can provide policymakers and public 17 health experts with important data with which to make evidence-18 based decisions about pesticide use.

19 The purpose of this Act is to protect the health of20 Hawaii's environment and people and enable more informed public

12	SECTION 2. Section 149A-26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
13	amended to read as follows:		
14	"[{]§149A-26[}] Post-application reporting of pesticide		
15	use. (a)	[Beginning January 1, 2019, every] <u>Every</u> user of	
16	restricted use pesticides shall be subject to the requirement to		
17	submit to the department, for departmental use, $[an annual] \underline{a}$		
18	monthly report of all use of restricted use pesticides as		
19	provided in this section.		
20	(b)	No later than thirty days following the end of each	
21	[calendar	year, month, every entity that uses restricted use	

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1 pesticides shall provide to the department a report of all 2 restricted use pesticides used during the preceding calendar 3 [year.] month. 4 The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter (C)5 91 requiring that the [annual] monthly reports include the following information: 6 7 (1)A listing, by federal and state registrations or 8 permit numbers, commercial product names, and active 9 ingredients, of all restricted use pesticides used; 10 The total quantities used for each restricted use (2) 11 pesticide[+], listed by type in pounds of active 12 ingredient applied and percentage of active ingredient found in any restricted use pesticide applied; 13 14 A [general] detailed description of the geographic (3) 15 location, including, at a minimum $[\tau]$: 16 (A) Geospatial data and information up to an area of 17 one square mile; 18 (B) Specific site information, including commodity or 19 crop information; and 20 (C) [the] The tax map key number, at which the 21 restricted use pesticides were used; and



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1 (4) The date on which the restricted use pesticide 2 application occurred." 3 SECTION 3. Section 149A-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended to read as follows: 5 "[+] §149A-27[+] Public reports; contents. The department 6 shall produce a summary, for public disclosure, by county, that 7 includes: 8 (1) The total quantities used, by federal and state 9 registrations or permit numbers, commercial product 10 names, and active ingredients, for each restricted use 11 pesticide used[; and], including a breakdown by type 12 in pounds of active ingredient applied and percentage 13 of active ingredient found in any restricted use 14 pesticide applied; 15 (2) The amount of area in the county in which the restricted use application occurred[-]; 16 17 (3) Geospatial data and information up to an area of one 18 square mile where the restricted use application 19 occurred; and



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1	(4) Specific site information, including commodity or crop
2	information where the restricted use application
3	occurred."
4	SECTION 4. The department of agriculture shall develop an
5	online reporting tool for restricted use pesticide reporting
6	pursuant to section 149A-26, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
7	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.

Description:

Requires the department of agriculture to develop an online reporting tool for restricted use pesticides.
