A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Alzheimer's disease
- 2 is a large and growing epidemic significantly impacting Hawaii.
- 3 More than six million Americans currently live with Alzheimer's
- 4 disease, a figure expected to reach 12.7 million in 2050.
- 5 2019, Alzheimer's disease was the sixth leading cause of death
- 6 in America, with deaths from the disease increasing one hundred
- 7 forty-five per cent between 2000 and 2019.
- 8 Additionally, one-third of home health care and adult day
- 9 care recipients have Alzheimer's disease or other dementias.
- 10 Average per-person medicaid spending for seniors with
- 11 Alzheimer's disease or other dementias is twenty-two times
- 12 greater than average per-person medicaid spending across all
- seniors without dementia. By 2050, spending on those with 13
- 14 Alzheimer's disease will total almost \$1,000,000,000,000.
- 15 The legislature further finds that the impact of
- 16 Alzheimer's disease in Hawaii is projected to rise. Currently,
- 17 twenty-nine thousand people ages sixty-five and older are living

- 1 with Alzheimer's disease; 6.7 per cent of people ages forty-five
- 2 and older have subjective cognitive decline; and fifty-two
- 3 thousand family members provide care for those with the disease.
- 4 In 2020, caregivers provided eighty-three million hours of care
- 5 at an economic value of nearly \$1,700,000,000.
- 6 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate
- 7 funds to the executive office on aging for an Alzheimer's
- 8 disease and related dementias public health campaign.
- 9 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
- 11 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the
- 12 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 13 2024-2025 for an Alzheimer's disease and related dementias
- 14 public health campaign that educates the public on early signs
- 15 of cognitive impairment, the value of early detection and
- 16 diagnosis, and benefits of discussing changes in memory and
- 17 thinking with health care professionals.
- 18 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the executive
- 19 office on aging for the purposes of this Act.

1 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
