A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 19-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "\$19-3 Election frauds. The following persons shall be
- 4 deemed guilty of an election fraud:
- 5 Every person who, directly or indirectly, personally (1) 6 or through another, gives, procures, or lends, or 7 agrees or offers to give, procure, or lend, or who 8 endeavors to procure, any money or office or place of 9 employment or valuable consideration to or for any 10 elector, or to or for any person for an elector, or to 11 or for any person in order to induce any elector to 12 vote or refrain from voting, or to vote or refrain 13 from voting for any particular person or party, or who 14 does any such act on account of any person having 15 voted or refrained from voting for any particular

person at any election;

(2)	Every person who advances or pays, or causes to be
	paid, any money to, or to the use of, any other
	person, with the intent that the money, or any part
	thereof, shall be expended in bribery at any election,
	or for any purpose connected with or incidental to any
	election; or who knowingly pays or causes to be paid
	any money to any person in the discharge or repayment
	of any money wholly or partly expended in bribery at
	any election, or for any purpose connected with or
	incidental to any election;

- (3) Every elector who, before, during, or after any election, directly or indirectly, personally or through another, receives, agrees, or contracts for any money, gift, loan, or valuable consideration, office, place, or employment for oneself or any other person for voting or agreeing to vote, or for refraining to vote or agreeing to refrain from voting, or for voting or refraining to vote for any particular person or party;
 - (4) Every person who, directly or indirectly, personally or through another, makes use of, or threatens to make

1	use of, any force, violence, or restraint; or inflicts
2	or threatens to inflict any injury, damage, or loss in
3	any manner, or in any way practices intimidation upon
4	or against any person in order to induce or compel the
5	person to vote or refrain from voting, or to vote or
6	refrain from voting for any particular person or
7	party, at any election, or on account of the person
8	having voted or refrained from voting, or voted or
9	refrained from voting for any particular person or
10	party; or who by abduction, distress, or any device or
11	contrivance impedes, prevents, or otherwise interferes
12	with the free exercise of the elective franchise;
13	provided that the practice of intimidation as
14	described in this paragraph includes, among other
15	actions:
16	(A) The carrying of any firearm or weapon; and
17	(B) The act of photographing the face of any voter
18	without permission from both the voter and an
19	appropriate election official,
20	at or within feet any voter service center,
21	place of deposit, or polling place;

1	(5)	Every person who, at any election, votes of accempts
2		to vote in the name of any other person, living or
3		dead, or in some fictitious name, or who, having once
4		voted, votes or attempts to vote again, or knowingly
5		gives or attempts to give more than one ballot for the

7	(6)	Every person who, before or during an election,
8		knowingly publishes a false statement of the
9		withdrawal of any candidate at the election;

(8) Every public officer by law required to do or perform any act or thing with reference to any of the provisions in any law concerning elections who wilfully fails, neglects, or refuses to do or perform the same, or who is guilty of any wilful violation of any of the provisions thereof;

2		with, disarrange, deface, or impair in any manner
3		whatsoever, or destroy any voting machine while the
4		same is in use at any election, or who, after the
5		machine is locked in order to preserve the
6		registration or record of any election made by the
7		same, tampers or attempts to tamper with any voting
8		machine;
9	(10)	Every person who, directly or indirectly, personally
10		or through another, wilfully designs, alters,
11		accesses, or programs any electronic voting system to
12		cause the system to inaccurately record, tally, or
13		report votes cast on the electronic voting system;
14	(11)	Every person who assists a voter in the completion of
15		a ballot in violation of section 11-139; and
16	(12)	Every person who knowingly broadcasts, televises,
17		circulates, publishes, distributes, or otherwise
18		communicates, including by electronic means or
19		advertisement, false information about the time, date
20		place, or means of voting with the purpose of

1	impeding, preventing, or otherwise interfering with
2	the free exercise of the elective franchise."
3	SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
4	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
5	begun before its effective date.
6	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
7	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Election Fraud; Intimidation; Firearms; Weapons; Photography; Voters

Description:

Specifies that the practice of election fraud intimidation includes, among other actions (1) The carrying of any firearm or weapon and (2) The act of photographing the face of any voter without permission from both the voter and an appropriate election official when such actions occur at or near a voter service center, place of deposit, or polling place.
