## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII HISTORIC PRESERVATION SPECIAL FUND.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it is in the public 2 interest to maintain and preserve the State's historic 3 government buildings. When Hawaii became the fiftieth state, 4 key elements of its multicultural heritage and culture were 5 incorporated into its government structures. These buildings 6 reflect Hawaii's Pacific-Asian values, making these structures unique within the United States and the world. At the same 7 8 time, older structures like Iolani Palace and other historic 9 government buildings provide critical links to Hawaii's monarchs 10 and Native Hawaiian population. In order to restore and 11 preserve the state capitol, Iolani Palace, and other historic 12 government properties, the State should adhere to the same 13 long-term planning, budgeting, and preservation standards that 14 are used to preserve privately held historic sites.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to develop a holistic approach toward the restoration and preservation of the State's historic government buildings by expressly allowing the

3	SECTION 2. Section 6E-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
4	amended by adding two new definitions to be appropriately		
5	inserted and to read as follows:		
6	""Comptroller" means the comptroller of the department of		
7	accounting and general services.		
8	"Department chairperson" means the chairperson of board of		
9	land and natural resources, unless the context otherwise		
10	requires."		
11	SECTION 3. Section 6E-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended to read as follows:		
13	"§6E-16 Hawaii historic preservation special fund. (a)		
14	There is established a Hawaii historic preservation special fund		
15	into which shall be deposited the following moneys:		
16	(1) Appropriations by the legislature to the special		
17	fund[; in an amount equal to per cent of the		
18	moneys appropriated for capital improvement projects		
19	in a given year;

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1 (2) Gifts, donations, historic preservation funding from 2 non-state sources, and grants from public agencies and 3 private persons; 4 (3)All proceeds collected by the department derived from 5 historic preserve user fees, historic preserve leases 6 or concession fees, fees charged to carry out the 7 purposes of this chapter, or the sale of goods; and 8 (4) Civil, criminal, and administrative penalties, fines, 9 and other charges collected under this chapter or any 10 rule adopted pursuant to this chapter. 11 All interest earned or accrued on moneys deposited in the fund 12 shall become part of the fund. 13 The fund shall be administered by the [department; (b) 14 provided that the department may contract with a public or 15 private agency-to provide the day-to-day management of the 16 fund.] comptroller, with an advisory group comprising: 17 (1)The department chairperson; 18 The state historic preservation officer; and (2) 19 (3) Preservation experts, who shall be selected and 20 invited to participate by the department director.
