# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PURCHASES OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to amend the procurement laws relating to the purchase of health and human 2 services to promote procurement efficiency, program success, and 3 government accountability. This Act (1) increases the efficiency 4 of short-term treatment purchase of services, and (2) increases 5 6 the small purchase threshold for health and human services from less than \$25,000 to less than \$100,000. 7 8 SECTION 2. Section 103F-404, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 9 "[+] §103F-404[+] Treatment purchase of services. (a) 10 11 Treatment services may be purchased in accordance with this section if [either or both of] the following circumstances are 12 13 applicable: [(1) Such services may become necessary from time to time, 14

6 (C) The [administrator] head of the purchasing agency, or 7 the purchasing agency's designee, shall form an initial review 8 committee for each profession, consisting of a minimum of three 9 employees from a state agency or agencies with sufficient 10 education, training, and licenses or credentials to evaluate the 11 statements of qualifications [which] that the [administrator] 12 head of the purchasing agency, or the purchasing agency's 13 designee, receives in response to the notice published pursuant 14 to subsection (b). The committee shall review and evaluate the 15 submissions and other pertinent information, including 16 references and reports, and prepare a list of qualified 17 providers to provide treatment services during the fiscal year. 18 Providers included on the list of qualified treatment providers 19 may amend their statements of qualifications as necessary or 20 appropriate. Providers shall immediately inform the 21 [administrator] head of the purchasing agency of any changes in

information furnished [which] that would disqualify the provider
 from being considered for a contract award.

3 (d) When the need to purchase treatment <u>services</u> arises,
4 the head of a purchasing agency shall select the provider most
5 qualified to provide the needed treatment <u>services</u> from the list
6 of qualified providers.

7 The head of the purchasing agency, or [a] the (e) purchasing agency's designee, shall negotiate a contract, 8 9 including a rate of compensation [which] that is fair and 10 reasonable, established in writing, and based upon the estimated value, scope, nature, and complexity of the treatment services 11 12 to be rendered, or use the rate established by the [administrator,] head of the purchasing agency, if any. 13 Ιf 14 negotiations fail, upon written notice of an impasse to the 15 provider selected under subsection (d), the head of the purchasing agency shall choose another provider from the list of 16 17 gualified providers, and conduct further negotiations. Negotiations shall be conducted confidentially. 18 (f) Contracts for treatment services in excess of \$100,000 19

3 SECTION 3. Section 103F-405, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4 amended to read as follows:

5 "[+] §103F-405[+] Small purchases. Purchases of health and 6 human services of less than [\$25,000] \$100,000 are small purchases, and shall be made in accordance with [section 103D-7 8 305 and] rules adopted by the policy board to implement [that] 9 this section. The threshold amount for goods and services set 10 out in section 103D-305 shall also apply to section 103F-405." SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 11 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 13 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its 14 approval. 15 INTRODUCED BY: MNN. 16

#### Report Title:

Procurement; Treatment Purchase of Services; Small Purchase Threshold

#### Description:

Authorizes heads of purchasing agencies to issue requests for statements of qualification and to establish lists of qualified providers for treatment purchase of services. Increases the small purchase threshold for health and human services.

JUSTIFICATION SHEET



DEPARTMENT: Accounting and General Services.

- TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PURCHASES OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.
- PURPOSE: To authorize the head of the purchasing agency, rather than the administrator of the State Procurement Office, to oversee the treatment purchase of services process. This bill also increases the small purchase threshold for health and human services from \$25,000 to \$100,000.
- MEANS: Amend sections 103F-404, and 103F-405, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).
- Health and human services are a high JUSTIFICATION: priority as residents continue to recover from the adverse health, social, and economic effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. Section 2 of this bill provides purchasing agencies an alternative way to competitively procure for health and human services that: (1) are sporadically used and (2) cannot be anticipated accurately on an annual basis. Treatment Purchase of Services method of procurement is intended to be used on a onetime, short-term basis. It is in the best interest of the State to allow each department to establish its own lists of qualified providers, when applicable.

Section 3 of this bill provides purchasing agencies an expedited way to competitively procure health and human services valued at less than \$100,000. The statute currently states that the small purchase threshold is less than \$25,000, but it should be aligned with section 103D-305, HRS, which is less than \$100,000.

In 2009, the small purchase threshold for chapter 103D, HRS, procurements was raised from \$50,000 to \$100,000 for goods or



services, and \$250,000 for construction. The small purchase threshold for health and human services remained unchanged at \$25,000.

Impact on the public: Expedited services for specific needs for the public.

Impact on the department and other agencies: Agencies would have the ability to establish and use their own lists of qualified providers as needed, specifically for the provision of health and human services.

Purchasing agencies will have an expedited way to competitively procure health and human services of less than \$100,000, with reduced administrative costs and burden to the State and provider community. This would free up scarce contracting workforce resources to execute complex high-dollar value procurements. Also, increasing the small purchase threshold will align with chapter 103D-305, HRS.
