<u>S</u>.B. NO. <u>1296</u> JAN 2 5 2023 A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DESIGNATED ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that being a U.S. 2 Economic Development Administration-designated economic
- 3 development district provides an opportunity to work
- 4 comprehensively to achieve locally developed goals that leverage
- 5 and build upon interrelated community assets, such as workforce,
- infrastructure, and housing. An economic development district 6
- 7 develops a long-term established relationship with the U.S.
- 8 Department of Commerce, Economic Development Administration that
- 9 includes annual federal funding to support the development and
- 10 implementation of the Hawaii comprehensive economic development
- 11 strategy. A U.S. Economic Development Administration investment
- 12 of federal funds is much more likely, on a per capita basis, to
- 13 be located in an economic development district area than in an
- 14 area that is not covered by an economic development district.
- 15 The legislature further finds that regional eligibility to
- 16 be designated as an economic development district by the U.S.
- **17** Economic Development Administration requires the region to have
- 18 a U.S. Economic Development Administration-approved

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1	comprehensive economic development strategy that contains a		
2	specific program for intra-district cooperation, self-help, and		
3	public investment, is approved by the affected state and the		
4	U.S. Economic Development Administration Assistant Secretary,		
5	obtains commitments from a majority of counties within the		
6	proposed district, and forms a district organization that meets		
7	the economic development district requirements. A district		
8	organization may be organized as a public organization		
9	established under state-enabling legislation for the creation of		
10	a multi-jurisdictional area-wide planning organization.		
11	To ensure that Hawaii is eligible for the substantial		
12	benefits of a U.S. Economic Development Administration-		
13	designated economic development district, the purposes of this		
14	Act are to:		
15	(1) Establish the Hawaii economic development district		
16	planning organization and governing board that meet		
17	the requirements of the U.S. Economic Development		
18	Administration, as provided in Title 13 Code of		
19	Federal Regulations Section 304.2, by being broadly		
20	representative of the principal economic interests of		
21	the region, including private sector, public		
22	officials, community leaders, representatives of		

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workforce development boards, institutions of higher 1 2 learning, minority and labor groups, and private 3 citizens; and Designate the office of planning and sustainable 4 (2) 5 development to organize the district organization 6 assisted by professional staff with economic 7 development planning qualifications. SECTION 2. Chapter 226, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 9 amended by adding to part II a new section to be appropriately 10 designated and to read as follows: 11 "§226-A Hawaii economic development district planning 12 organization. (a) There is established the Hawaii economic 13 development district planning organization, which shall be the 14 district organization to implement the U.S. Economic Development 15 Administration-approved comprehensive economic development 16 strategy. The Hawaii economic development district planning 17 organization shall be placed within the department of business, 18 economic development, and tourism and attached to the office of 19 planning and sustainable development for administrative 20 purposes. 21 The Hawaii economic development district planning 22 organization shall:

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1	(1)	Develop, manage, and support effective multi-level
2		partnerships in order to promote intra-district
3		cooperation, self-help, and public investment to
4		restore and sustain economic resilience and
5		prosperity;
6	(2)	Support organizations within the economic development
7		district to apply for funding;
8	(3)	Implement the U.S. Economic Development Administration
9		approved comprehensive economic development strategy;
10		and
11	(4)	Present to the governor and legislature any annual
12		updates to the comprehensive economic development
13		strategy.
14	<u>(c)</u>	The Hawaii economic development district planning
15	organizat	ion shall be headed by a board that shall be composed
16	of fiftee	n members as follows:
17	(1)	Director of the office of planning and sustainable
18		development, or designated representative, who shall
19		serve as chair;
20	(2)	The mayor of each county, or designated
21		representative;

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1	(3)	The executive director of each county economic
2		development board, or designated representative;
3	(4)	A representative of each county workforce development
4		board to be designated by the chair of the respective
5		board;
6	(5)	The president of the University of Hawaii, or
7		designated representative; and
8	(6)	A representative of a labor organization to be
9		appointed by the governor.
10	<u>(d)</u>	The nongovernmental members of the Hawaii economic
11	developme	nt district planning organization board shall serve for
12	no more t	han two consecutive terms of four years and without
13	compensat	ion but shall be reimbursed for expenses, including
14	travel ex	penses, necessary for the performance of their duties.
15	Members s	hall not be subject to section 26-34(a).
16	<u>(e)</u>	The Hawaii economic development district planning
17	organizat	ion board shall hold public meetings, subject to
18	chapter 9	2, at least twice a year."
19	SECT	ION 3. There are established two full-time temporary
20	exempt ec	conomic development planning analyst positions to
21	support t	he Hawaii economic development district planning

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1	organization to be paid out of the general revenues of the State
2	of Hawaii.
3	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
4	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$200,000 or so much
5	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the
6	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
7	2024-2025 to carry out the purposes of this Act, including the
8	hiring of necessary staff.
9	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
10	of business, economic development, and tourism.
11	SECTION 5. In codifying the new section added by section 2
12	of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute an
13	appropriate section number for the letter used in designating
14	the new section in this Act.
15	SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 7. This Act, upon its approval, shall take effect
17	on July 1, 2023.

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO DESIGNATED

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT.

PURPOSE: To establish a Hawaii Economic Development

District Planning Organization and board;

designate the Office of Planning and

Sustainable Development to organize a Hawaii

Economic Development District Planning Organization; establish two positions to support the district planning organization and board; and appropriate funds for the new

positions and program expenses.

MEANS: Add a new section to part II of chapter 226,

Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION: A U.S. Department of Commerce, Economic Development Administration-designated

Economic Development District includes

annual funding to support the implementation

of the Hawaii Comprehensive Economic

Development Strategy (CEDS). An Economic Development District provides substantial direct investment of federal funds in all parts of the State; creates an ability to

resources and build on community

interrelated assets; and increases positive impacts on rural counties and the regional economy. Designation requires a District Organization with a board of directors and

work comprehensively to leverage new federal

staff, as provided in Title 13 Code of

Federal Regulations Section 304.2.

Impact on the public: A U.S. Department of Commerce, Economic Development Administration-designated Economic Development District will increase federal investments in locally supported economic adjustment and public works projects.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
Positive impact on the department and other
state and county agencies' ability to access
increased federal funds for economic
development projects. There will be no
negative impacts as all federal project
funds are applied for and awarded to Hawaii
agencies and nonprofits for community
supported projects.
