### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NURSES LICENSED IN ANOTHER JURISDICTION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 457, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to re	ad as follows:
4	" <u>§45</u>	7- Temporary permit. (a) The board may issue a
5	temporary	permit to an out-of-state licensed practical nurse or
6	registere	d nurse who has applied and met the following
7	requireme	nts:
8	(1)	Completed an application on a form prescribed by the
9		board;
10	(2)	Paid all fees established by title 16, chapter 53,
11		Hawaii Administrative Rules, that are made applicable
12		to board of nursing;
13	(3)	Provided proof of a valid and unencumbered license in
14		another state, territory, or country by way of a
15		license verification from the other state, territory,
16		or country or Nursys license verification report
17		pursuant to section 16-89-16(2), Hawaii Administrative
18		Rules;

1	(4)	Completed the fingerprinting requirement for a federal
2		and state criminal record check; and
3	(5)	Submitted to the board a certified copy of the self-
4		query report from the National Practitioners Databank.
5	<u>(b)</u>	An individual who currently holds a multistate license
6	issued by	another state may also meet the requirements for a
7	temporary	permit; provided the individual has met the following
8	requiremen	nts:
9	(1)	Completed an application on a form prescribed by the
10		board;
11	(2)	Paid all fees established by title 16, chapter 53,
12		Hawaii Administrative Rules, that are made applicable
13		to board of nursing;
14	(3)	Provided proof of a valid and unencumbered multistate
15		license in another state, territory, or country by way
16		of a Nursys license verification report pursuant to
17		section 16-89-16(2), Hawaii Administrative Rules. For
18		purposes of this section, a "multistate license" means
19		a license to practice as a licensed practical nurse or
20		registered nurse issued by a home state licensing
21		board that authorizes the licensed nurse to practice

1		in all party states under a multistate licensure
2		privilege;
3	(4)	Submitted to the board a certified copy of the self-
4		query report from the National Practitioners Databank.
5	<u>(c)</u>	A temporary permit may only be issued to an applicant
6	who has b	een appointed or accepted employment with a single
7	health ca	re entity listed in section 321-11(10).
8	<u>(d)</u>	A temporary permit shall be valid only for a period of
9	six month	s from the date of issuance. In no case shall a permit
10	issued he	reunder be valid for more than a period of six months
11	from the	date of issuance. A new and separate temporary permit
12	may be is	sued provided that the requirements of subsection (a)
13	or (b) ha	ve been satisfied."
14	SECT	ION 2. Section 457-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
16	"(b)	Licenses shall be granted either by:
17	(1)	Examination: The applicant shall be required to pass
18		a written examination in nursing subjects as
19		determined by the board. Upon the applicant's passage
20		of the examination and compliance with the applicable
21		requirements of this chapter and the rules of the

1 board, the board shall issue to the applicant a license to practice nursing as a registered nurse; or 2 Endorsement: The board may issue a license to 3 (2) practice nursing as a registered nurse by endorsement 4 to an applicant who has been licensed as a registered 5 nurse under the laws of another state, territory, or foreign country if the applicant has an unencumbered 7 8 license and, in the opinion of the board, the 9 applicant meets the qualifications required of the 10 registered nurses in this State at the time of 11 graduation. [Pending verification of a valid, 12 unencumbered license from another state, territory, or 13 foreign country, a temporary permit may be issued for 14 employment with a Hawaii employer.] " SECTION 3. Section 457-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 16 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 17 "(b) Licenses shall be granted either by: 18 (1) Examination: The applicant shall be required to pass 19 a written examination in nursing subjects as 20 determined by the board. Upon the applicant's passage 21 of the examination and compliance with the applicable requirements of this chapter and the rules of the 22

1 board, the board shall issue to the applicant a license to practice nursing as a licensed practical 2 3 nurse; or 4 (2) Endorsement: The board may issue a license to practice nursing as a licensed practical nurse by 5 endorsement to any applicant who has been licensed as 6 7 a licensed practical nurse, or a person entitled to 8 perform similar services under a different title, 9 under the laws of another state, territory, or foreign 10 country if the applicant has an unencumbered license and, in the opinion of the board, the applicant meets 11 the requirements for licensed practical nurses in this 12 State at the time of graduation. [Pending 13 verification of a valid, unencumbered license from 14 another state, territory, or foreign country, a 15 temporary permit may be issued for employment with a 16 Hawaii employer.]" 17 SECTION 4. Section 457-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 19 amended to read as follows: 20 "§457-13 Exceptions. This chapter does not prohibit: The furnishing of nursing assistance in an emergency; 21 (1)

12		and in emergency situations, other premeasured

21	SECT	ION 5. The department of commerce and consumer affairs
22	may adopt	interim rules to establish fees for the administration

- 1 of this Act. All fees collected shall be deposited to the
- 2 credit of the compliance resolution fund established pursuant to
- 3 section 26-9(o), Hawaii Revised Statutes. Fees assessed shall
- 4 be used to carry out the purposes of this Act without regard to
- 5 chapter 91 or 201M, Hawaii Revised Statutes; provided that:
- 6 (1) The department shall hold at least one public hearing
- 7 prior to the adoption of interim rules; and
- 8 (2) The interim rules shall be effective for no more than
- 9 one year after their adoption.
- 10 SECTION 6. The department of commerce and consumer affairs
- 11 may employ necessary personnel without regard to chapter 76,
- 12 Hawaii Revised Statutes, including one full-time permanent
- 13 office assistant, for the purposes of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
- 15 revenues of the state of Hawaii the sum of \$78,426 or so much
- 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the
- 17 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 18 2024-2025 to be deposited into the compliance resolution fund.
- 19 SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the compliance
- 20 resolution fund the sum of \$78,426 or so much thereof as may be
- 21 necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the same sum or so much

1	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to
2	implement the regulation of nurses as required by this Act.
3	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
4	of commerce and consumer affairs for the purposes of this Act.
5	SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
6	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
7	SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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#### Report Title:

Nurses; Registered Nurses; Licensed Practical Nurses; Licenses; Endorsement; Temporary Permits; Exceptions

#### Description:

Allows for temporary permits to be issued to registered nurses and licensed practical nurses, and revises the exemptions for license.

#### JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Commerce and Consumer Affairs

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO NURSES

LICENSED IN ANOTHER JURISDICTION.

PURPOSE: To clarify the issuance for a temporary

permit for nurses and revise exceptions to the license requirements to allow for a nurse who accompanies a patient to Hawaii

temporarily.

MEANS: Add a new section to chapter 457 and amend

sections 457-7(b), 457-8(b), and 457-13,

Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION: Historically, there has been a high demand

for nurses in the State. The COVID-19 pandemic exacerbated the issue and nearly dwindled the State's nursing workforce to a critical low. The issuance of a temporary permit for nurses to work in this State temporarily will help mitigate the nursing shortage by streamlining the licensure process and recognizing licensure in another jurisdiction. This change would also allow

time for the individual nurse to complete the regular licensing process while still

being able to practice.

This bill will also allow a nurse who is licensed in another jurisdiction to accompany a patient who requires nursing care without first having to apply for and be issued a license by the Board of Nursing. For example, nurses often accompany patients for organizations such as Make-A-Wish to ensure continuity of care and appropriate care in cases of emergencies.

Impact on the public: Currently, the nursing shortage has reached a critical stage for our healthcare system. The proposed amendments would streamline the issuance of a temporary permit for nurses who could then work in Hawaii's healthcare

facilities and entities so that Hawaii residents can receive the care they need.

Impact on the department and other agencies:

The Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs' Professional and Vocational

Licensing Branch may require an additional

office assistant to process temporary

permits. Interim rulemaking will be needed

to establish fees for this permit.
