BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 16 the board."

Description:

Updates definitions related to the education and training requirements of psychologists; amends the screening process for applicants educated at a foreign institution.

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT:

Commerce and Consumer Affairs

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO LICENSE REQUIREMENTS FOR PSYCHOLOGISTS.

PURPOSE:

To add and update definitions related to education and training requirements of psychologists and amend the application review process for those applicants whose doctoral degree was obtained in a foreign institution.

MEANS:

Amends sections 465-1 and 465-7.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).

JUSTIFICATION:

The Hawaii Board of Psychology (Board) administers chapter 465, HRS, and finds that the chapter has outdated definitions and provisions that make administration unnecessarily complex related to the education and training of applicants and licensees, as well as the review process of foreign educated applicants.

To resolve these issues, the Board proposes to add the definition of "American Psychological Association," expand the definition of "continuing education," and further clarify the definitions of "institution of higher education" and "professional psychology training program." Further changes are proposed to make the review process of foreign educated applicants by the Board congruent with the new definitions and current national practices.

Impact on the public: Updating the definitions and provisions related to the education and training of psychologists, including those that are foreign educated, will ensure that psychologists accessed by the public meet current educational standards and be able to provide safe and effective care.

Impact on the department and other agencies: Updating the definitions and further clarifying the screening process of foreign educated applicants set forth by section 465-7.5, HRS, will reduce the time and use of resources spent by the Board on unnecessary issues caused by misunderstanding and misinterpretation of

the statutes' complex language on the
