### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the American Academy
- 2 of Pediatrics recommends that the first school bell ring no
- 3 earlier than 8:30 a.m. nationwide. Early school start times are
- 4 associated with students sleeping less, and, along with
- 5 irritability and fatique, students who sleep less may experience
- 6 difficulty paying attention in class, negatively affecting
- 7 students' academic performance. In Hawaii, all but five public
- 8 high schools begin their school days before 8:30 a.m.
- **9** The purpose of this Act is to require all public high
- 10 schools to start school days at 9:00 a.m. and public elementary
- 11 and middle schools to start school days no earlier than 8:30
- 12 a.m.
- 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 15 and to read as follows:
- 16 "\$302A- School day start time. (a) Notwithstanding any
- 17 other law to the contrary, beginning with the school

- 1 year, each public high school in the State, excluding charter
- 2 schools, shall begin school days at 9:00 a.m.; provided that the
- 3 school day for all public elementary and middle schools in the
- 4 State, excluding charter schools, shall begin no earlier than
- 5 8:30 a.m.; provided further that regardless of school day start
- 6 time, each school shall be subject to the minimum instructional
- 7 time requirements under section 302A-251.
- **8** (b) The board, in its discretion, may grant a waiver to
- 9 any school that is subject to the start time requirements of
- 10 this section. The board shall adopt policies and procedures to
- 11 grant a waiver under this subsection.
- (c) For purposes of this section, "school day" includes a
- 13 "zero period", or an extra period offered before the start of
- 14 regular classes."
- 15 SECTION 3. The department of education shall adjust state-
- 16 provided school bus and school meal schedules for public schools
- 17 to align with the school day start times set forth in section 2
- 18 of this Act.
- 19 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

### Report Title:

Department of Education; School Days; Start Time

### Description:

Beginning with the - school year, requires public high schools to start at 9:00 a.m. and public elementary and middle schools to start no earlier than 8:30 a.m. Requires the Department of Education to adjust state-provided bus and school meal schedules accordingly.

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
