RELATING TO MOTOR CARRIER VEHICLE INSPECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 286-209, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- amended to read as follows: 2
- 3 "§286-209 Safety inspection of motor carrier
- (a) Motor carrier vehicles, including but not 4
- limited to trucks, truck-tractors, semitrailers, trailers, or 5
- pole trailers, having a gross vehicle weight rating of more than 6
- 7 ten thousand pounds, motor carrier vehicles having a gross
- 8 vehicle weight rating of ten thousand pounds or less which
- transport passengers in the furtherance of a commercial 9
- 10 enterprise, including car rental transport vehicles, and motor
- carrier vehicles used in transporting material found by the 11
- 12 United States Secretary of Transportation to be hazardous under
- 13 49 U.S.C. section 5103 and transported in a quantity requiring
- placarding under 49 C.F.R., subtitle B, chapter I, subchapter C, 14
- shall be inspected and certified annually. 15

The director shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 1 2 for the administration and enforcement of motor carrier vehicle safety inspections, including the maximum inspection fee to 3 vehicle owners, fees collected from the stations, the issuance 4 of certificates of safety inspection, the affixing of motor 5 6 carrier vehicle safety inspection [decals,] stickers, and the acceptance of certificates of safety inspection issued in other 7 jurisdictions. 8 9 The director shall initially collect a fee of \$1.50 10 for each motor carrier vehicle safety inspection [decal] sticker 11 issued by motor carrier vehicle inspection stations [-], then 12 collect the maximum inspection fee when the fee is established 13 by administrative rules pursuant to subsection (b). All moneys 14 [collected] received by the department of transportation 15 pursuant to this section shall be [paid] deposited into the 16 state highway fund. 17 (d) A fee of no more than \$12 shall initially be charged by a motor carrier inspection station for each safety inspection 18 performed[-], then no more than the maximum inspection fee shall 19 be charged when the fee is established by administrative rules 20 21 pursuant to subsection (b).

1	(e) For the purposes of this section, "car rental
2	transport vehicles" means motor carrier vehicles used to
3	transport customers to or from car rental sites."
4	SECTION 2. Section 286-210, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	"§286-210 Operation of a motor carrier vehicle without a
7	safety inspection [decal.] sticker. Whoever operates, permits
8	the operation of, causes to be operated, or parks any motor
9	carrier vehicle on a public highway without a current motor
10	carrier vehicle safety inspection [decal,] sticker, issued under
11	section 286-209, shall be fined \$100 for each day of the
12	violation."
13	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
14	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
15	begun, before its effective date.
16	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
17	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
18	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
