### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the significant rise
- 2 in online harassment and attacks that has occurred in the last
- 3 ten years, particularly as national and international internet
- 4 usage has increased exponentially, and where protective
- 5 legislation has lagged woefully behind. This includes, more
- 6 recently, individuals feeling empowered by the increasingly
- 7 polarized global political climate to release their grievances,
- 8 anger, and hate online and direct the same at specific
- 9 individuals due, in part, to the lack of any real consequences
- 10 as a result thereof.
- 11 The legislature further finds that more appropriate
- 12 remedies and more substantial penalties are particularly
- 13 important where among the most frequently targeted groups of
- 14 these increased attacks are women and members of disenfranchised
- 15 minority communities, both ethnic as well as sexual, and where
- 16 their complaints as to the same have gone largely unheeded,
- 17 leaving them feeling victimized and vulnerable.



1 The purpose of this Act is to: 2 Prohibit cyber harassment and cyberstalking; and (1) Allow for civil liabilities and injunctions for cyber 3 (2) 4 harassment and cyberstalking. SECTION 2. Chapter 603, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 6 and to read as follows: 7 8 "§603- Action to enjoin violation of section 711- . 9 (a) Any person may maintain an action to enjoin a continuance 10 of any act in violation of section 711- . 11 (b) A person who is the victim of cyber harassment or 12 cyberstalking, or the parent or legal guardian of a minor child 13 who is living at home, who seeks an injunction for protection 14 against cyber harassment or cyberstalking on behalf of the minor 15 child has standing in the court to file a petition for an 16 injunction for protection against cyber harassment and 17 cyberstalking. 18 The cause of action for an injunction for protection 19 may be sought regardless of whether any other cause of action is

currently pending between the parties. However, the pendency of

any cause of action shall be alleged in the petition.

- 1 (d) The cause of action for an injunction does not require
  2 either party to be represented by an attorney.
- 3 (e) The court shall not issue mutual orders of protection;
- 4 however, the court is not precluded from issuing separate
- 5 injunctions for protection against cyber harassment and
- 6 cyberstalking if each party has complied with section 711- .
- 7 Compliance with section 711- shall not be waived.
- 8 (f) In addition to orders of protection, the court may
- 9 also issue an order of no-contact, which may include an absolute
- 10 prohibition on referencing or alluding to the aggrieved person
- 11 via any electronic device or social networking site. This
- 12 relief may include, at the court's discretion, an order to
- 13 delete any and all offending accounts owned or accessible by the
- 14 perpetrator through any electronic device."
- 15 SECTION 3. Chapter 663, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 17 and to read as follows:
- 18 "§663- Cyber harassment and cyberstalking liability. In
- 19 addition to criminal penalties, an aggrieved person may initiate
- 20 a civil action against any person or entity who violates section

1	711- in order to obtain all appropriate relief, including but
2	not limited to the following:
3	(1) Monetary damages, including punitive damages; and
4	(2) Reasonable attorneys' fees and costs."
5	SECTION 4. Chapter 711, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
7	and to read as follows:
8	"§711- Cyber harassment and cyberstalking. (1) A
9	person commits the offense of cyber harassment and cyberstalking
10	if, while making one or more electronic communication via any
11	electronic device or through any social networking site, and
12	with the purpose of harassing, intimidating, tormenting, or
13	embarrassing another, the person communicates or causes to be
14	communicated, posts or causes to be posted, displays or causes
15	to be displayed, or distributes or causes to be distributed
16	information that:
17	(a) Threatens or alludes to the infliction of injury or
18	physical harm to the victim, to any person related to,
19	or affiliated with the victim, or to the personal
20	property of the victim;

I	<u>(a)</u>	Contains raise statements concerning the death,
2		injury, illness, disfigurement, indecent conduct, or
3		criminal conduct of the victim;
4	<u>(c)</u>	Contains lewd, indecent, or obscene material to or
5		about the victim that would emotionally harm a
6		reasonable person or place a reasonable person in fear
7		of physical or emotional harm to their person; or
8	<u>(d)</u>	Entices, excites or aggravates any other person to
9		engage in a similar type of conduct as stated in
10		paragraphs (a), (b), and (c).
11	(2)	Cyber harassment and cyberstalking is a misdemeanor
12	for the f	irst offense and a class C felony for the second or
13	subsequen	t offense.
14	(3)	Prosecution under this section does not preclude
15	prosecuti	on under any other law. Nothing in this section is
16	intended	to affect any civil remedies available for a violation
17	of this s	ection.
18	(4)	Any person, including any minor under the age of
19	eighteen,	who is adjudicated delinquent for cyber harassment or
20	cyberstal	king, may be ordered by the court as a condition of the
21	sentence	(in the event the person is a minor under the age of

1 eighteen, then accompanied by a parent or guardian), to 2 complete, in a satisfactory manner, one or both of the 3 following: A class or training program intended to reduce the 4 (a) 5 tendency toward cyber harassment behavior; or 6 A class or training program intended to bring (b) 7 awareness to the dangers associated with cyber-8 harassment. 9 Any person, including any parent or guardian who fails to comply 10 with a condition imposed by the court pursuant to this 11 subsection, shall be fined not more than \$500 for a first 12 offense and not more than \$1,000 for each subsequent offense. 13 (5) The court may infer that a person acted with a purpose 14 to harass another within the meaning of this section if the 15 person knows or should have known that any of the person's 16 actions constitute an offense herein. 17 (6) For purposes of this section: 18 "Course of conduct" means a pattern of conduct composed of

a series of acts over a period of time, however short, which

evidences a continuity of purpose.

1	"Electronic communication" means any transfer of signs,		
2	signals, writing, images, sounds, data, or intelligence of any		
3	nature transmitted in whole or in part by a wire, radio,		
4	electromagnetic, photoelectronic, or photo-optical system.		
5	"Electronic device" includes telephones, cell phones,		
6	computers, internet web pages or sites, internet phones, e-mail,		
7	text messages, video messages, personal data assistants, video		
8	recorders, fax machines, and any and all other devices capable		
9	of transmitting data or sending signals to another.		
10	"Harass" means a knowing and wilful course of conduct		
11	directed at a specific person that a reasonable person would		
12	consider as seriously alarming, seriously annoying, seriously		
13	tormenting, or seriously terrorizing and that serves no		
14	legitimate purpose.		
15	"Social networking site" means an internet website, the		
16	primary purpose of which is facilitating social interaction with		
17	other users of the website and has the following capabilities:		
18	(a) Allows users to create web pages or profiles about		
19	themselves that are available to the general public or		
20	to any other users; and		
21	(b) Offers a mechanism for communication among users."		

- 1 SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
