A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGHWAYS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is an
- 2 opportunity to generate renewable energy using lands in the
- 3 state highways rights-of-way. Other jurisdictions across the
- 4 country have successfully and safely deployed solar power by
- 5 installing solar panels in shoulders and medians. Green energy
- 6 initiatives can contribute to the achievement of the State's
- 7 clean energy goals while achieving energy security and
- 8 resilience in rural communities.
- 9 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to establish within
- 10 the department of transportation, a highways clean energy
- 11 technology pilot program.
- 12 SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the department
- 13 of transportation a highways clean energy technology pilot
- 14 program.
- 15 (b) The pilot program shall determine clean energy
- 16 technology projects, in compliance with federal Highways

- 1 Administration requirements and regulations, that may be
- 2 installed on any state road on the island of Molokai.
- 3 (c) The department of transportation shall determine the
- 4 type of clean energy technology to install within, on, or around
- 5 its highways facilities.
- 6 (d) The pilot program shall cease to exist on July 1,
- 7 2025.
- 8 (e) As used in this section, "clean energy technology"
- 9 means any technology as defined in section 269-121(b), Hawaii
- 10 Revised Statutes.
- 11 SECTION 3. The department of transportation shall submit a
- 12 report of its findings and recommendations, including any
- 13 proposed legislation, on the application of clean energy
- 14 technology within, on, or around highways facilities to the
- 15 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 16 the regular session of 2025.
- 17 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 18 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 19 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
- 20 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 21 year 2024-2025 for the implementation of the pilot program to

- 1 include costs for planning, design, construction, and
- 2 operations.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 4 of transportation for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
