#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A MODERN HAWAII HISTORY MUSEUM.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Bernice Pauahi 2 Bishop Museum generally covers pre-contact and early Hawaiian 3 history and that Iolani Palace covers the Hawaiian monarchy and overthrow era. However, the State has much to celebrate and 4 share since then. The legislature further finds that the State 5 6 has made national and global impact that is not preserved and exhibited, including the history of its World War II generation 7 of leaders, statehood, and groundbreaking political wins that 8 9 have led the nation and influenced the rest of the country. 10 Notably, Hawaii has led the nation through policies, such as: 11 (1)The passage of Title IX of the Education Amendments of 12 1972, which prohibits sex discrimination in any 13 education program or activity receiving federal financial assistance: 14 15 (2) The enactment of Act 1, Session Laws of Hawaii 1970, which decriminalized abortion;

2	There is established within the foundation the museum of modern		
3	Hawaii history. The operations of the museum of modern Hawaii		
4	history shall be funded and supported by the modern Hawaii		
5	history special fund established pursuant to section 9-B.		
6	(b) The museum of modern Hawaii history shall:		
7	(1) Focus on the territorial and statehood eras of the

13	(c) The foundation may establish a nonprofit group or		
14	select a nonprofit group with the demonstrated qualifications to		
15	manage and operate the museum of modern Hawaii history, its		
16	concessions, or other for-profit business enterprises in a		
17	manner that is self-sustaining.		
18	§9-B Modern Hawaii history special fund. (a) There is		
19	established in the state treasury the modern Hawaii history		

20 special fund, into which shall be deposited:

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1 (1)All revenues from the operations of the museum of 2 modern Hawaii history, including any concession fees; Appropriations made by the legislature to the fund; 3 (2) 4 and Any gifts, donations, and grants from public agencies 5 (3) and private persons. 6 All interest earned or accrued on moneys deposited in the fund 7 shall become part of the fund. The fund shall be administered 8 9 by the foundation; provided that the foundation may contract 10 with a public or private agency to provide the day-to-day 11 management of the fund. Moneys in the modern Hawaii history special fund shall 12 (b) 13 be used for the planning, design, construction, administration, and operational costs of the museum of modern Hawaii history." 14 15 SECTION 3. There is established a museum of modern (a) Hawaii history task force within the foundation on culture and 16 17 the arts for administrative purposes to prepare the plans, specifications, and designs for the construction of the museum 18 19 of modern Hawaii history. 20 (b) The working group shall consist of the following



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members:

1	(1)	The executive director of the foundation on culture

13	Members of the task force may recommend additional members with		
14	appropriate special expertise to the task force, for approval by		
15	the chair.		
16	(c) The task force may invite developers to prepare plans,		
17	specifications, and designs for the construction of the museum,		
18	and review for approval the proposed museum development plans		
19	submitted by developers. The task force shall supervise all		
20	development of the museum pursuant to the development plan		
21	approved by the task force.		

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1 (d) The working group shall submit an annual report of its 2 progress, findings and recommendations, including any proposed 3 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior 4 to the convening of each regular session. 5 (e) The members of the task force shall serve without 6 compensation shall be reimbursed for expenses, including travel expenses, necessary for the performance of their duties. 7 8 (f) No member of the working group shall be subject to 9 chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, solely because of the 10 member's participation in the task force. 11 (q) The task force shall be dissolved on January 28, 2027. 12 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much 14 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the 15 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 16 2024-2025 into the modern Hawaii history special fund 17 established pursuant to section 9-B, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 18 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the modern Hawaii 19 history special fund the sum of \$250,000 or so much thereof as 20 may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 21

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for the planning and design of the museum of modern Hawaii
history.

3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the foundation4 on culture of the arts for the purposes of this Act.

5 SECTION 6. In codifying the new sections added by 6 section 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute 7 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating 8 the new sections in this Act.

9 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
