A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FOOD INNOVATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that supporting
- 2 innovation and expansion in various disciplines is critical to
- 3 the State's economy. According to the Hawaii state planning
- 4 act, supporting innovative work in the culinary arts,
- 5 value-added production, food production, and other areas, can
- 6 help diversify the State's economic base.
- 7 The legislature further finds that the food production and
- 8 food distribution industries are undergoing dramatic changes.
- 9 Emerging technology and social media offer new ways to develop
- 10 and promote products, reach new markets, and optimize sales.
- 11 Hawaii's food businesses have opportunities to support local
- 12 food security while also expanding into wider markets. It is
- 13 critical to the success of Hawaii's economic development and
- 14 food security goals to support the businesses that are helping
- 15 to grow the State's agriculture and food industries.
- 16 The legislature recognizes that a growing statewide network
- 17 exists in Hawaii that is doing innovative work in food



- 1 production and food systems. The Culinary Institute of the
- 2 Pacific, Wahiawa Value-added Product Development Center, Central
- 3 Oahu Agriculture and Food Hub, Maui Food Innovation Center,
- 4 Kekaha Food Innovation Center, and others are helping to support
- 5 Hawaii's agribusinesses and food entrepreneurs. The network is
- 6 also providing residents with marketable knowledge, skills, and
- 7 training in agriculture, food production, food distribution,
- 8 culinary arts, and other related fields. The legislature
- 9 believes these kinds of innovation networks benefit the State.
- 10 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a food
- 11 and product innovation network office and food and product
- 12 innovation network advisory council to inform legislation and
- 13 provide a coordinated and strategic approach to food systems
- 14 innovation.
- 15 SECTION 2. Chapter 163D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately
- 17 designated and to read as follows:
- 18 "§163D- Food and product innovation network office;
- 19 established. (a) There is established the food and product
- 20 innovation network office. The office shall be placed within
- 21 the agribusiness development corporation for administrative

2	network o	ffice shall be to assist the State in achieving its	
3	economic	development and food security goals through food	
4	systems innovation.		
5	(b)	The food and product innovation network office shall:	
6	(1)	Provide analysis, information, and planning to assist	
7		the legislature, state agencies, and other relevant	
8		stakeholders in developing policies to help meet the	
9		State's economic development and food security goals;	
10		and	
11	(2)	Coordinate and encourage cooperation among food system	
12		innovation assets in each region across the State.	
13	(c)	No later than twenty days prior to the convening of	
14	each regu	lar session, the food and product innovation network	
15	office sh	all submit a report to the legislature including:	
16	(1)	A description of the food and product innovation	
17		network office's activities in the preceding year and	
18		the office's progress toward meeting the directives	
19		established in subsection (b);	
20	(2)	An assessment of any progress Hawaii has made in	
21		growing the agriculture industry, food industry, and	

1	related indus	cries, and in meeting the State's food
2	security goals	s; and
3	(3) Any proposed	legislation.
4	§163D- Food and	d product innovation network advisory
5	council. (a) There is	established a food and product
6	innovation network advis	sory council that shall serve in an
7	advisory capacity to the	e administrators of the food and product
8	innovation network offic	ce. The council shall consist of eleven
9	members, including seven	n appointed members and four ex officio,
10	voting members.	
11	(b) The seven appo	pinted members shall comprise:
12	(1) One member has	ving experience in food production, food
13	distribution,	or marketing, to be appointed by the
14	senate;	
15	(2) One member ha	ving experience in food production, food
16	distribution,	or marketing, to be appointed by the
17	house of repre	esentatives;
18	(3) One member of	the university of Hawaii board of
19	regents having	g experience in career training related
20	to agricultur	e, business, information systems, or

1		marketing, to be appointed by the chair of the board
2		of regents;
3	(4)	One member of the board of education having experience
4		in curriculum development or instruction in
5		agriculture, information systems, or marketing, to be
6		appointed by the chair of the board of education;
7	<u>(5)</u>	Three members of the workforce development council, to
8		be appointed by the council; provided that one member
9		shall represent management, one member shall represent
10		labor, and one member shall represent the public.
11	<u>(c)</u>	The four ex officio, voting members shall comprise:
12	(1)	The chairperson of the board of agriculture, or the
13		chairperson's designee;
14	(2)	The director of business, economic development, and
15		tourism, or the director's designee;
16	<u>(3)</u>	The executive director of the agribusiness development
17		corporation; and
18	(4)	The executive director of the P-20 partnership for
19		education.
20	(d)	Of the three members first appointed by each
21	appointing authority, one shall be appointed for two years, one	

1	shall be	appointed for three years, and one shall be appointed
2	for four	years. The member appointed from the board of
3	education	shall be appointed for the remainder of the member's
4	remaining	term on the board of education. Upon the expiration
5	of the te	rms of the first members, their successors shall serve
6	for a term	m of four years. Vacancies shall be filled by the
7	appropria	te appointing authority for the unexpired term.
8	<u>(e)</u>	The council shall elect a chairperson and other
9	officers	as the council deems necessary. Section 92-15 shall
10	apply. T	he members of the council shall serve without
11	compensat	ion but shall be entitled to expenses for traveling
12	within th	e State to attend meetings of the council or when
13	engaged i	n business relating to the work of the council.
14	<u>(f)</u>	The council shall provide recommendations and advice
15	to the fo	od and product innovation network office on:
16	(1)	Major international and national trends in food
17		production, manufacturing, packaging, distribution,
18		and marketing, and employment needs in these fields
19		that can be addressed locally;
20	(2)	Critical steps and resources to take advantage of
21		specific, high-priority innovation measures;

1	(3) A framework for creating a public directory for		
2	businesses involved in food production, distribution,		
3	marketing, and education, including:		
4	(A) Farmers and other producers;		
5	(B) Manufacturers, including commercial kitchens;		
6	(C) Processors;		
7	(D) Exporters;		
8	(E) Educators; and		
9	(F) Food distribution and hubs;		
10	(4) Any legislation needed to support food and product		
11	innovation in the State."		
12	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
13	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so		
14	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and		
15	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal		
16	year 2024-2025 for the food and product innovation network		
17	office and food and product innovation network advisory council		
18	established pursuant to this Act.		
19	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the agribusiness		
20	development corporation for the purposes of this Act.		
21	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.		

1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
