A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that mental health 2 conditions are treated in various ways, depending on the condition, and can include medication, therapy, and psychosocial 3 4 services. Congress, through the proposed Breakthrough Therapies 5 Act, and the United States Food and Drug Administration have 6 indicated that methylenedioxymethamphetamine, commonly known as MDMA, and psilocybin will be rescheduled to enable its 7 8 therapeutic use. Methylenedioxymethamphetamine and psilocybin 9 have already been granted the United States Food and Drug 10 Administration's breakthrough therapy designation to fast-track 11 . research and potential approval, given their efficacy in 12 treating treatment-resistant depression and post-traumatic 13 stress disorder. These treatments, while effective for certain 14 conditions and patients, do not treat all mental health 15 conditions. Research supports the effectiveness of natural and alternative medicines and therapies, such as the use of 16 methylenedioxymethamphetamine, psilocybin, and other therapies, 17

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1	as safe and effective ways to treat depression, post-traumatic			
2	stress disorder, addiction, end-of-life psychological distress,			
3	and other afflictions.			
4	The purpose of this Act is to establish the beneficial			
5	treatments advisory council to review, evaluate, and recommend			
6	new medicinal treatments for mental health.			
7	SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
8	amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately			
9	designated and to read as follows:			
10	" <u>§321-</u> Beneficial treatments advisory council;			
11	established. (a) There is established within the department of			
12	health for administrative purposes only, a beneficial treatments			
13	advisory council. The membership of the council shall be as			
14	follows:			
15	(1) Five of the members shall be the following ex officio			
16	voting members, or their respective designees:			
17	(A) The executive director of the office of wellness			
18	and resilience, who shall serve as the			
19	chairperson of the advisory council;			
20	(B) The attorney general;			

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1		(C)	The chairpersons of the senate and house standing
2			committees having responsibility for legislation
3			on health; and
4		(D)	The chairperson of the state council on mental
5			health; and
6	(2)	Four	of the members shall be appointed pursuant to
7		sect	ion 26-34 and shall consist of:
8		<u>(A)</u>	A physician who is duly licensed pursuant to
9			chapter 453 or an advanced practice registered
10			nurse who is authorized to prescribe psychotropic
11			medication and is duly licensed pursuant to
12			chapter 457;
13		<u>(B)</u>	A physician duly licensed pursuant to chapter
14			453, with specialties in substance abuse and
15			psychiatry;
16		<u>(C)</u>	One representative from an organization that
17			advocates for the therapeutic use of plant-based
18			psychedelic modalities; and
19		<u>(D)</u>	One representative from an accredited research
20			institution providing certification and training

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1		for professionals on the use of psychedelic					
2		modalities.					
3	(b)	The members of the advisory council shall serve					
4	without c	ompensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses,					
5	including travel expenses, necessary for the performance of						
6	their duties.						
7	(c)	The beneficial treatments advisory council shall:					
8	(1)	Examine federal, state, and local laws, regulations,					
9		administrative rules, and procedures regarding the					
10		treatment of mental health;					
11	(2)	Examine available medical, psychological, and					
12		scientific studies, research, and other information					
13		relating to the safety and efficacy of methods to					
14		treat mental health conditions;					
15	(3)	Examine requirements, specifications, and guidelines					
16		for a medical professional to prescribe and provide					
17		various treatments to patients in jurisdictions in					
18		which the treatment is used to treat mental health					
19		<pre>conditions;</pre>					
20	(4)	Develop a long-term strategic plan to ensure the					
21		availability of therapeutic psilocybin,					



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1		psilocybin-based products, and
2		methylenedioxymethamphetamine that are safe,
3		accessible, and affordable for adults twenty-one years
4		of age or older; and
5	(5)	Advise the department on new and revised mental health
6		treatment options."
7	SECT	ION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
8	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect on December 31,
9	2050.
