A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CULTURE AND ARTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the aloha order of
- 2 merit was established to recognize Hawaii individuals who have
- 3 made significant contributions in the fields of national or
- 4 international achievement either in a single event or by the
- 5 totality of work that has either been pioneering in that field
- 6 or that has been outstanding in the long term.
- 7 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish the
- 8 Hawaii leadership awards program to honor Hawaii individuals who
- 9 have made considerable and outstanding contributions to Hawaii
- 10 in their respective fields and serve as inspirations to others.
- 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 12 by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately designated
- 13 and to read as follows:
- 14 "§9- Hawaii leadership awards program. (a) There is
- 15 established within the foundation for administrative purposes
- 16 the Hawaii leadership awards program to honor individuals who:

7	(1)	Receive a certificate of honor and medal;
8	(2)	Have the awardee's story and a statement of
9		recognition displayed in a conspicuous place for a

13	(e)	Awardees shall be selected by a Hawaii leadership
14	awards sel	ection committee. The selection committee shall

4	(f) Nominations for awardees shall be accepted by the		
5	Hawaii leadership awards selection committee from the public."		
6	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
7	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so		
8	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and		
9	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal		
10	year 2024-2025 to establish the Hawaii leadership awards		
11	program.		
12	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the state		
13	foundation on culture and the arts for the purposes of this Act		
14	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.		
15	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
