A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that reports have named
 Hawaii roads the most dangerous in the nation to pedestrians
 aged sixty-five and over. In 2022, there were one hundred and
 seventeen traffic-related fatalities in the State. This is an
 increase from the ninety-five traffic-related fatalities that
 occurred within the State in 2014.

7 The legislature further finds that it currently takes the
8 State five to seven years to make simple but urgent traffic
9 safety fixes to better protect people. The legislature believes
10 that the State should enable critical safety projects to be
11 implemented faster, and at lower costs, to help save lives.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to increase traffic safety by allowing the director of transportation to exempt certain ground transportation facility projects from historic preservation review and the environmental impact statement law, subject to certain conditions.

7	either adding no more the twelve feet in width to any existing			
8	hardened travel surface, or providing for a new hardened travel			
9	surface of no more than twelve feet in width."			
10	SECTION 3. If any provision of this Act, or the			
11	application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held			
12	invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or			
13	applications of the Act that can be given effect without the			
14	invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions			
15	of this Act are severable.			
16	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.			

17 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
