A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 302A-1106.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 1
- 2 is amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§302A-1106.5 Board of education; community [meetings.]
- 4 [The board shall hold not less than one community
- meeting annually in each county in] In addition to [their] its 5
- 6 regular meetings, the board shall hold not less than six
- 7 community forums annually to discuss and receive input from the
- community on public education and public library issues [-]; 8
- 9 provided that the board shall hold at least one community forum
- in each county. The board chairperson shall designate less than 10
- a quorum of board members to attend [the] each community 11
- 12 [meetings.] forum and shall appoint one designated member as
- 13 chair of the community forum. These community [meetings] forums
- 14 shall not be held for the purpose of formulating educational
- policy. The community [meetings] forums shall be [exempt from 15
- 16 sections 92 2.5, 92 7, 92 9, and 92 41; provided that the board
- 17 shall give written public notice of each community meeting. The

1	meeting n	otice shall indicate the date, time, and place of the
2	meeting,	and shall be filed in the office of the lieutenant
3	governor	and in the board's office for public inspection six
4	calendar	days before the meeting. The notice shall also be
5	posted at	the site of the meeting. a permitted interaction
6	under sec	tion 92-2.5; provided that:
7	(1)	The board shall give a written public notice that
8		indicates the date, time, and place of each community
9		forum; provided further that the notice shall be
10		subject to the same posting and filing requirements of
11		board meeting notices, pursuant to section 92-7(b);
12	(2)	Community forums shall be open to the public and all
13		persons shall be permitted to attend; provided further
14		that, upon order of the chair of the community forum,
15		the removal of any person or persons who wilfully
16		disrupts a community forum to prevent and compromise
17		the conduct of the community forum shall not be
18		<pre>prohibited;</pre>
19	(3)	The board shall afford all interested persons an
20		opportunity to submit data, views, or arguments, in

1		writing or in person, on any public education or
2		public library issues at each community forum;
3	(4)	No commitment relating to a vote on a matter is made
4		or sought at any community forum; and
5	(5)	At the next duly noticed meeting of the board, the
6		board members shall report their attendance and the
7		matters presented and discussed at the community
8		forum."
9	SECTION 2. At any public meeting properly noticed pursuant	
10	to chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the board of education	
11	shall include an open forum at the end of its meeting agenda to	
12	afford all interested persons an opportunity to present oral	
13	testimony on any matter not on the agenda; provided that the	
14	testimony is related to matters over which the board of	
15	education has supervision, control, jurisdiction, or advisory	
16	power.	
17	SECT	ION 3. The board of education shall submit a report of
18	its effor	ts to amend its policies to include an open forum at
19	the end o	f its meeting agenda to afford all interested persons
20	an opport	unity to present oral testimony on any matter not on

- 1 the agenda, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
- 2 to the convening of the regular session of 2024.
- 3 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.

Board of Education; Community Forums; Public Meetings; Oral Testimony

Description:

Requires the Board of Education to hold not less than six community forums annually, with at least one community forum in each county. Requires the Board to include an open forum for public comments on non-agenda items. Requires a report to the Legislature on implementing open forums.

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
