# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LABOR STANDARDS AT HEALTH CARE FACILITIES.

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to establish a
2	health care facilities labor standards working group to
3	research, assess, and make recommendations on the best practices
4	in labor standards that can be implemented at hospitals, care
5	homes, and dialysis facilities in the State.
6	SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the department
7	of health for administrative purposes only, the health care
8	facilities labor standards working group to research, assess,
9	and make recommendations on the best practices in labor
10	standards that can be implemented at hospitals, care homes, and
11	dialysis facilities in the State.
12	(b) The working group shall research, assess, and make
13	recommendations on:
14	(1) The potential benefits and impacts associated with the
15	implementation and enforcement of labor standards at
16	hospitals, care homes, and dialysis facilities in the
17	State, including but not limited to the establishment
18	and enforcement of:



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1		(A) Minimum staffing standards;
2		(B) Hospital staffing committees; and
3		(C) Mandatory meal breaks, rest breaks, and overtime
4		standards;
5	(2)	The best practices in labor standards that can be
6		implemented at hospitals, care homes, and dialysis

8	(3)	Any other issues that may arise, pursuant to the

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(4) Three members with experience in the health care
industry, including nurses and others working in
health care facilities and unions representing health
care workers to be selected by the speaker of the
house of representatives.

6 (d) The health care facilities labor standards working 7 group may request assistance and feedback from the department of 8 health and the department of labor and industrial relations to 9 provide expertise to assist the working group in carrying out 10 their duties.

(e) The health care facilities labor standards working group shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2025.

16 (f) The members of the health care facilities labor 17 standards working group shall serve without compensation but 18 shall be reimbursed for expenses, including travel expenses, 19 necessary for the performance of their duties.

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(g) No member of the working group shall be subject to
chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, solely because of the
member's participation in the working group.

4 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on December 31,5 2050.
