A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE SECURITY OF PUBLIC PLACES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 2 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 "§46- Public places special fund. (a) There is
- 5 established the public places special fund into which shall be
- 6 deposited the revenues prescribed by section 237D-6.5(b)(5) and
- 7 all investment earnings credited to the assets of the fund.
- 8 (b) Moneys in the special fund shall be allocated to the
- 9 counties in proportion to the amount of transient accommodations
- 10 taxes collected in each county under chapter 237D.
- 11 (c) Moneys in the special fund shall be used exclusively
- 12 to contract private security to work with county law enforcement
- 13 to enforce state or county laws, rules, ordinances, or
- 14 regulations prohibiting camping, loitering, nuisance, or other
- 15 violations in public places."
- 16 SECTION 2. Section 237D-6.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

- 16 (2) \$11,000,000 shall be allocated to the convention 17 center enterprise special fund established under 18 section 201B-8;
- 19 (3) An allocation shall be deposited into the tourism
 20 emergency special fund, established in section 201B21 10, in a manner sufficient to maintain a fund balance

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1		of \$5,000,000 in the tourism emergency special fund;

Report Title:

Public Places Special Fund; Transient Accommodations Taxes; Public Places; Security; Violations

Description:

Creates a Public Places Special Fund to fund hiring private security to work with county law enforcement to enforce state or county laws, rules, ordinances, or regulations prohibiting camping, loitering, nuisance, or other violations in public places. Allocates .005 per cent of the transient accommodations tax to the Public Places Special Fund to be allocated to the counties in proportion to the amount of tax collected in each county.

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
