A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PARTIAL PUBLIC FINANCING OF ELECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The amounts of funds available to candidates in 2 Hawaii's partial public financing program were last amended in 3 1995. The legislature finds that since 1995-1996, the value of the dollar has risen to approximately \$1.92. The purpose of 4 5 this Act is to: 6 Increase the amount of funds available to candidates (1)7 who qualify to participate in the partial public financing program; 8 9 Increase the amount of funds available to candidates (2) 10 for the board of trustees of the office of Hawaiian 11 affairs, who run statewide; Increase matching fund payments from \$1 for each \$1 of 12 (3) 13 qualifying contributions in excess of the minimum 14 qualifying contribution amounts to \$2 for each \$1 of 15 excess qualifying contributions; and 16 Appropriate funds from the general revenues of the (4)

State to increase the amount of funds available in the

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1	partial public financing program and to permit the
2	campaign spending commission to hire more staff to
3	address the anticipated increase in participation in
4	the financing program.
5	SECTION 2. Section 11-425, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	"§11-425 Maximum amount of public funds available to
8	candidate. (a) The maximum amount of public funds available in
9	each election to a candidate for the office of governor,
10	lieutenant governor, or mayor of the city and county of Honolulu
11	and county of Hawaii, shall not exceed [ten] fifteen per cent of
12	the expenditure limit established in section 11-423(d) for each
13	election.
14	(b) The maximum amount of public funds available in each
15	election to a candidate for the office of state senator, state
16	representative, mayor of the county of Kauai and county of Maui,
17	county council member, and prosecuting attorney shall not exceed
18	[fifteen] 22.5 per cent of the expenditure limit established in
19	section 11-423(d) for each election.
20	(c) For the office of Hawaiian affairs, the maximum amount
21	of public funds available to a candidate shall not exceed

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2 limit established in section 11-423(d) for each election. [(d) For all other offices, the maximum amount of public 3 4 funds available to a candidate shall not exceed \$100 in any 5 election year. 6 (e) [(d) Each candidate who qualified for the maximum 7 amount of public funding in any primary election and who is a 8 candidate for a subsequent general election shall apply with the 9 commission to be qualified to receive the maximum amount of

[\$1,500 in any election year.] ten per cent of the expenditure

- public funds as provided in this section for the respective

 general election. For purposes of this section, "qualified"

 means meeting the qualifying campaign contribution requirements

 of section 11-429."
- 14 SECTION 3. Section 11-429, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 15 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
- "(a) As a condition of receiving public funds for a

 17 primary or general election, a candidate shall not be unopposed

 18 in any election for which public funds are sought, shall have

 19 filed an affidavit with the commission pursuant to section
- 20 11-423 to voluntarily limit the candidate's campaign

11		(D) County of Kauaiqualifying contributions that in
12		the aggregate exceed \$3,000;

14		contributions that, in the aggregate exceed \$2,500;
15	(7)	For the office of state representativequalifying
16		contributions that, in the aggregate, exceed \$1,500;
17	(8)	For the office of Hawaiian affairsqualifying
18		contributions that, in the aggregate, exceed [\$1,500;]
19		\$5,000; and
20	(9)	For all other offices, qualifying contributions that,
21		in the aggregate, exceed \$500.

9	(B) Payments of [\$	1] \$2 for each \$1 of qualifying		
10	contributions	in excess of the minimum qualifying		
11	contribution a	mounts; and		
12	(2) A candidate shall h	ave at least one other qualified		
13	candidate as an opp	onent for the primary or general		
14	election to receive	public funds for that election."		
15	SECTION 4. There is app	ropriated out of the general		
16	revenues of the State of Hawa	ii the sum of \$ or so		
17	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and			
18	the same sum or so much there	of as may be necessary for fiscal		
19	year 2024-2025 to be deposite	d into the Hawaii election campaign		
20	fund.			

- 1 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii
- 2 election campaign fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof
- 3 as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the same sum
- 4 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025
- 5 for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the campaign
- 7 spending commission for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$200,000 or so much
- 10 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the
- 11 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 12 2024-2025 for two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) permanent
- 13 positions to be placed within the campaign spending commission.
- 14 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the campaign
- 15 spending commission for the purposes of this Act.
- 16 SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 17 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 18 begun before its effective date.
- 19 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 20 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 21 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.

Report Title:

Hawaii Campaign Spending Commission Package; Partial Public Financing; Office of Hawaiian Affairs; Maximum Amount of Public Funds Available; Minimum Qualifying Contribution Amounts; Appropriations

Description:

Increases the maximum amount of public funds available for all offices by fifty per cent. Increases the maximum amount of public funds available for a candidate for the Office of Hawaiian Affairs from \$1,500 to ten per cent of the expenditure limit for each election. Increases the amounts of qualifying contributions for the Office of Hawaiian Affairs from more than \$1,500 to more than \$5,000 in the aggregate. Provides a downward adjustment of the amounts of qualifying contributions for the Office of Prosecuting Attorney for the City and County of Honolulu, County of Hawaii, and County of Kauai and for the Office of County Council for the County of Maui. Appropriates unspecified sums for the increase in the Partial Public Financing Program. Appropriates \$200,000 for the Campaign Spending Commission to hire two additional staff members. (SD1)

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
