A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the American Academy 2 of Pediatrics recommends that the first school bell ring no
- 3 earlier than 8:30 a.m. nationwide. Early school start times are
- associated with students sleeping less, and, along with 4
- 5 irritability and fatique, students who sleep less may experience
- 6 difficulty paying attention in class, negatively affecting
- 7 students' academic performance. In Hawaii, all but five public
- 8 high schools begin their school days before 8:30 a.m.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to require all public
- 10 elementary, middle, and high schools to start school days no
- 11 earlier than 8:30 a.m.
- 12 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- and to read as follows: 14
- 15 "\$302A- School day start time. (a) Notwithstanding any
- 16 other law to the contrary, beginning with the school
- **17** year, all public elementary, middle, and high schools in the

- 1 State, excluding charter schools, shall begin no earlier than
- 2 8:30 a.m.; provided that regardless of school day start time,
- 3 each school shall be subject to the minimum instructional time
- requirements under section 302A-251. 4
- The board, in its discretion, may grant a waiver to 5
- any school that is subject to the start time requirements of 6
- 7 this section. The board shall adopt policies and procedures to
- 8 grant a waiver under this subsection.
- 9 (c) For purposes of this section, "school day" includes a
- 10 "zero period", or an extra period offered before the start of
- regular classes." 11
- SECTION 3. The department of education shall adjust state-12
- provided school bus and school meal schedules for public schools 13
- 14 to align with the school day start times set forth in section 2
- 15 of this Act.
- SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored. 16
- 17 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
