A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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PART I

2 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there are multiple state agencies responsible for housing. The existence of 3 multiple separate agencies creates redundancies and 4 bureaucracies that hinder the work of solving Hawaii's housing 5 6 crisis. The purpose of this Act is to consolidate the Hawaii 7 housing finance and development corporation, Hawaii community development authority, Hawaii public housing authority, and 8 9 office of planning and sustainable development into a new 10 department of housing.

PART II

SECTION 2. Chapter 26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

15 "<u>§26-</u> Department of housing. (a) The department of
16 housing shall be headed by a single executive to be known as the
17 director of housing.

Section 26-18, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 10 "(b) The following are placed in the department of 11 business, economic development, and tourism for administrative 12 purposes as defined by section 26-35: [Hawaii community 13 development authority, Hawaii housing finance and development 14 corporation, Hawaii technology development corporation, natural 15 energy laboratory of Hawaii authority, and any other boards and 16 commissions as shall be provided by law." 17 SECTION 6. Section 26-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 amended to read as follows: 19 "§26-52 Department heads and executive officers. The 20 salaries of the following state officers shall be as follows:

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The salary of the superintendent of education shall be 1 (1)2 set by the board of education at a rate no greater than \$250,000 a year. The superintendent shall be 3 subject to an annual performance evaluation that is in 4 alignment with other employee evaluations within the 5 department of education and are based on outcomes 6 7 determined by the board of education; provided that nothing shall prohibit the board of education from 8 9 conditioning a portion of the salary on performance; 10 The salary of the president of the [University] (2) 11 university of Hawaii shall be set by the board of 12 regents; 13 Effective July 1, 2004, the salaries of all department (3) 14 heads or executive officers of the departments of 15 accounting and general services [7]; agriculture [7]; 16 attorney general $[\tau]$; budget and finance $[\tau]$; business, 17 economic development, and tourism[7]; commerce and consumer affairs $[\tau]$; corrections and 18 19 rehabilitation[_]; Hawaiian home lands[_]; health[_]; 20 housing; human resources development $[\tau]$; human services $[\tau]$ is a bor and industrial relations $[\tau]$ is a land 21



1 and natural resources [7]; law enforcement [7]; 2 taxation[$_{\tau}$]; and transportation shall be as last 3 recommended by the executive salary commission. Effective July 1, 2007, and every six years 4 thereafter, the salaries shall be as last recommended 5 6 by the commission on salaries pursuant to section 26-7 56, unless rejected by the legislature; and 8 (4) The salary of the adjutant general shall be \$85,302 a year. Effective July 1, 2007, and every six years 9 10 thereafter, the salary of the adjutant general shall 11 be as last recommended by the commission on salaries 12 pursuant to section 26-56, unless rejected by the 13 legislature, except that if the state salary is in conflict with the pay and allowance fixed by the 14 15 tables of the regular Army or Air Force of the United 16 States, the latter shall prevail."

SECTION 7. Section 225M-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, isamended to read as follows:

19 "\$225M-1 Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to
20 establish an office of planning and sustainable development to
21 assist the governor; the director of housing; the director of

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1 business, economic development, and tourism; the legislature; 2 and state and county agencies in maintaining an overall 3 framework to guide the development of the State through a 4 continuous process of comprehensive, long-range, and strategic 5 planning to meet the physical, economic, and social needs of 6 Hawaii's people, and provide for the wise use of Hawaii's 7 resources in a coordinated, efficient, and economical manner, 8 including the conservation of those natural, environmental, recreational, scenic, historic, and other limited and 9 10 irreplaceable resources which are required for future 11 generations. 12 The establishment of an office of planning and sustainable 13 development in the department of [business, economic 14 development, and tourism,] housing, for administrative purposes, 15 is intended to: 16 (1) Fix responsibility and accountability to successfully 17 carry out statewide planning programs, policies, and 18 priorities; 19

19 (2) Improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the
20 operations of the executive branch; and

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1 (3) Ensure comprehensive planning and coordination to 2 enhance the quality of life of the people of Hawaii." 3 SECTION 8. Section 356D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 5 "(a) There is established the Hawaii public housing 6 authority to be placed within the department of [human-services] 7 housing for administrative purposes only. The authority shall 8 be a public body and a body corporate and politic." 9 SECTION 9. Sections 201H-2, 201H-3, 206E-3, and 225M-2, 10 Hawaii Revised Statutes, are amended by substituting the phrase 11 "department of housing" wherever the phrase "department of 12 business, economic development, and tourism" appears, as the 13 context requires. 14 SECTION 10. Sections 201H-3, 206E-3, 225M-2, 225M-3, and 15 225M-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, are amended by substituting the 16 phrase "director of housing" wherever the phrase "director of 17 business, economic development, and tourism" appears, as the 18 context requires. 19 SECTION 11. (a) All rights, powers, functions, and duties

20	No officer or employee of the State having tenure shall		

21 suffer any loss of salary, seniority, prior service credit,

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1 vacation, sick leave, or other employee benefit or privilege as 2 a consequence of this Act, and such officer or employee may be 3 transferred or appointed to a civil service position without the necessity of examination; provided that the officer or employee 4 5 possesses the minimum qualifications for the position to which 6 transferred or appointed; and provided that subsequent changes 7 in status may be made pursuant to applicable civil service and 8 compensation laws.

9 An officer or employee of the State who does not have 10 tenure and who may be transferred or appointed to a civil 11 service position as a consequence of this Act shall become a 12 civil service employee without the loss of salary, seniority, 13 prior service credit, vacation, sick leave, or other employee 14 benefits or privileges and without the necessity of examination; 15 provided that such officer or employee possesses the minimum 16 qualifications for the position to which transferred or 17 appointed.

18 If an office or position held by an officer or employee
19 having tenure is abolished, the officer or employee shall not
20 thereby be separated from public employment, but shall remain in
21 the employment of the State with the same pay and classification



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and shall be transferred to some other office or position for
 which the officer or employee is eligible under the personnel
 laws of the State as determined by the head of the department or
 the governor.

(c) All rules, policies, procedures, guidelines, and other 5 material adopted or developed by the transferred agencies to 6 7 implement provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes that are 8 reenacted or made applicable to the department of housing by this Act shall remain in full force and effect until amended or 9 10 repealed by the department of housing pursuant to chapter 91, 11 Hawaii Revised Statutes. In the interim, every reference to the 12 department of business, economic development, and tourism and 13 department of human services as they pertain to the transferred agencies in those rules, policies, procedures, guidelines, and 14 15 other material is amended to refer to the department of housing, 16 as appropriate.

(d) All deeds, leases, contracts, loans, agreements, permits, or other documents executed or entered into by or on behalf of the department of business, economic development and tourism and the department of human services as they pertain to the transferred agencies, pursuant to the provisions of the

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1 Hawaii Revised Statutes that are reenacted or made applicable to 2 the department of housing by this Act shall remain in full force and effect. Effective July 1, 2024, every reference to the 3 4 department of business, economic development, and tourism and 5 the department of human services as they pertain to the transferred agencies in those deeds, leases, contracts, loans, 6 agreements, permits, or other documents shall be construed as a 7 reference to the department of housing. 8

(e) All appropriations, records, equipment, machines, 9 10 files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents, maps, and 11 other personal property heretofore made, used, acquired, or held 12 by the department of department of business, economic development and tourism and the department of human services 13 14 relating to the functions transferred to the department of 15 housing shall be transferred with the functions to which they 16 relate.

SECTION 12. This Act does not affect rights and duties
that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that
were begun before its effective date.

20 SECTION 13. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



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SECTION 14. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
