A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is the only
state without a fire marshal's office. In 1978, the office of
the state fire marshal was abolished and its functions and
responsibilities relating to the protection of persons and
property against fire loss with the respective county
governments was transferred to the counties through Act 241,
Session Laws of Hawaii 1978.

The legislature further finds that the state fire marshal 8 9 would serve as an integral role in coordinating fire prevention 10 between local agencies. The legislature recognizes that the state fire council currently does not have the funding and staff 11 12 to perform the duties of a state fire marshal. The legislature 13 further recognizes that reestablishing the position of the state fire marshal would fill gaps in state and local enforcement, 14 15 provide leadership in fire and arson investigations, and ensure wildfire risk is mitigated as much as possible. 16
