A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC NOTICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that posting notices
- 2 electronically is more expedient and cost-effective than
- 3 publishing notices on paper, particularly for routine but
- 4 time-sensitive situations. Clean water environmental hazard
- 5 advisories and urgent conditions like disaster-related response
- 6 and recovery activities may be posted more effectively online
- 7 than in print.
- 8 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to provide
- 9 government agencies the option to publish notices via a posting
- 10 on the agency's official website, in lieu of or in addition to
- 11 publishing in a daily or weekly publication such as a printed
- newspaper.
- 13 However, the legislature affirms that under general rules
- 14 of statutory construction, where two statutes conflict, the more
- 15 specific statute is followed. As a result, since section
- 16 1-28.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is a general statute, this Act
- 17 is not intended to supersede procedures that, for example,

1	assure transparency in public administration such as chapters 91
2	and 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
3	SECTION 2. Section 1-28.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
5	"(a) Notwithstanding any other statute, law, charter
6	provision, ordinance, or rule to the contrary, whenever a
7	government agency is required to give public notice or to
8	publish notice, the notice shall be given only as follows:
9	(1) For statewide publication:
10	(A) In a daily or weekly publication of statewide
11	circulation; or
12	(B) By publication in separate daily or weekly
13	publications whose combined circulation is
14	statewide; [and]
15	(2) For county-wide publication, by publication in a daily
16	or weekly publication in the affected county[+
17	Additional supplemental notice may also be given through Hawaii
18	FYI, the State's interactive computer system.]; or
19	(3) For either statewide or county publication, as
20	applicable, by posting on an electronic calendar on ar

1	official website for legal notices maintained by the
2	State or appropriate county."
3	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
4	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
5	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
