A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE HEALTH PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT AGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

2	SECTION 1. Section 323D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
3	amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted		
4	and to read as follows:		
5	""Health care" means the improvement of a person's health		
6	through the prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and amelioration		
7	or cure of disease, illness, injury, or other physical and		
8	mental impairment, regardless of the setting in which those		
9	services are delivered. "Health care" includes oral health,		
10	behavioral health, and long-term care."		
11	SECTION 2. Section 323D-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended to read as follows:		
13	"§323D-12 Health planning and development functions; state		
14	agency . (a) The state agency shall:		
15	(1) Have as a principal function the responsibility for		
16	promoting [accessibility for all the people of the		
17	State to quality health care services at reasonable		



1		cost. The state agency shall conduct such studies and
2		investigations as may be necessary as to the causes of
3		health care costs including inflation. The state
4		agency may contract for services to implement this
5		paragraph. The certificate of need program mandated
6		under part V shall serve this function. The state
7		agency shall promote the sharing of facilities or
8		services by health care providers whenever possible to
9		achieve economies and shall restrict unusual or
10		unusually costly services to individual facilities or
11		providers where appropriate;] universal access to
12		high-quality, equitable, and affordable health care
13		for all the people of the State;
14	(2)	[Serve as staff to and provide technical assistance
15		and advice to the statewide council and the subarea
16		councils in the preparation, review, and revision of
17		the state health services and facilities plan;]
18		Provide, throughout state government, coordination of
19		activities and resources that affect health care
20		access, costs, and quality, including health insurance
21		coverage rates, health insurance benefits,



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1		affordability, workforce health, reimbursements,
2		quality, administrative simplification, workforce
3		development, and health information technology;
4	(3)	[Conduct the health planning activities of the State
5		in coordination with the subarea councils, implement
6		the state health services and facilities plan, and
7		determine the statewide health needs of the State
8		after consulting with the statewide council; and]
9		Establish a state health services, workforce, and
10		facilities plan and update that plan every four years
11		following consultation with the statewide council;
12	(4)	Administer the state certificate of need program
13		pursuant to part $V[-]$, and serve as staff to and
14		provide technical assistance and advice for the
15		statewide council and subarea councils; and
16	(5)	The state agency shall submit the first state health
17		services, workforce, and facilities plan developed
18		pursuant to paragraph (3) to the legislature no later
19		than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
20		session of 2026 and the updated plan no later than

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1		twenty days prior to the convening of every fourth
2		regular session of the legislature thereafter.
3	(b)	The state agency may:
4	(1)	Prepare [such] reports and recommendations on Hawaii's
5		health care costs and public or private efforts to
6		reduce or control costs and <u>improve</u> health care
7		quality as [it] <u>the state agency</u> deems necessary.
8		[The] A report may include [, but not be limited to,] a
9		review of health insurance $plans[_{ au}]_{:}$ the availability
10		of various kinds of health insurance and malpractice
11		insurance to consumers $[\tau]$; related health statistics
12		as necessary to monitor and improve health care
13		access, outcomes, equity, quality, costs, and
14		cost-effectiveness; and strategies for increasing
15		competition in the health insurance field $[-,]$ and
16		across the health care delivery system;
17	[(2)	Prepare and revise as necessary the state health
18		services and facilities plan.
19	(3)	Prepare, review, and revise the annual implementation
20		plan.

2		of its functions[-];
3	[- (-5)-]	(3) Determine the need for new health services
4		proposed to be offered within the State[\pm];

18		care rationing, involuntary care, care for the
19		indigent, and standards for research and development
20		of biotechnology [and], genetic engineering[-], remote

2		development; and
3	[-(9) -]	(7) Conduct [such] other activities as are necessary
4		to meet the purposes of this chapter."

6	SECT	ION 3. (a) There is established the hui hoʻomana
7	within the	e state health planning and development agency for
8	administra	ative purposes only, to make recommendations to achieve
9	universal	access and equity to quality health care at an
10	affordable	e cost for state residents.
11	(b)	The hui hoʻomana shall consist of the following
12	members:	
13	(1)	The administrator of the state health planning and
14		development agency, or the administrator's designee;
15	(2)	The chief of staff from the office of the governor, or
16		the chief of staff's designee;
17	(3)	The director of health, or the director's designee;
18	(4)	The director of human services, or the director's
19		designee;
20	(5)	The director of commerce and consumer affairs, or the
21		director's designee;

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1	(6)	The director of corrections and rehabilitation, or the
2		director's designee;
3	(7)	The director of the executive office on aging, or the
4		director's designee;
5	(8)	The insurance commissioner, or the commissioner's
6		designee;
7	(9)	The chief executive officer of the Hawaii health
8		systems corporation, or the chief executive officer's
9		designee;
10	(10)	The administrator of the Hawaii employer-union health
11		benefits trust fund, or the administrator's designee;
12	(11)	The dean of the university of Hawaii John A. Burns
13		school of medicine, or the dean's designee;
14	(12)	The dean of the university of Hawaii Nancy Atmospera-
15		Walch school of nursing, or the dean's designee;
16	(13)	The dean of the university of Hawaii Daniel K. Inouye
17		college of pharmacy, or the dean's designee; and
18	(14)	Two members from the statewide health coordinating
19		council, to be selected and invited by the
20		administrator of the state health planning and
21		development agency.

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1	(c)	The administrator of the state health planning and
2	developme	nt agency shall invite the following individuals or
3	their des	ignees to participate on the hui ho'omana:
4	(1)	The president and chief executive officer of the
5		Healthcare Association of Hawaii;
6	(2)	The president of the Hawaii Association of Health
7		Plans; and
8	(3)	Any additional members deemed necessary by the
9		administrator of the state health planning and
10		development agency.
11	(d)	The first meeting of the hui ho'omana shall be held no
12	later tha	n thirty days after the effective date of this Act, at
13	which tim	e the members shall elect a chair, vice chair, and any
14	other nec	essary officers from among its members.
15	(e)	A majority of the hui hoʻomana members present at any
16	given mee	ting shall constitute a quorum to conduct business.
17	(f)	The hui hoʻomana shall meet no less than quarterly and
18	may meet	more often than quarterly. The state health planning
19	and devel	opment agency shall provide administrative and clerical
20	support r	equired by the hui hoʻomana.
21	(g)	The hui hoʻomana shall:

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1 Assist the state health planning and development (1)2 agency in the development of a state health services, 3 workforce, and facilities plan; Identify and prioritize necessary actions for a 4 (2)5 comprehensive plan to provide universal access to 6 equitable and affordable high-quality health care for 7 state residents; 8 (3) Determine a responsible party, timelines, and deadline 9 for each necessary action identified in the state 10 health services, workforce, and facilities plan; and 11 (4) Identify resources required and funding options, which 12 may include financing from private, federal, and state 13 entities. 14 (h) Members of the hui ho'omana shall serve without 15 compensation but may be reimbursed for reasonable expenses 16 necessary for the performance of their duties, including travel 17 expenses.

18 (i) The hui ho'omana shall submit a preliminary report of
19 its progress to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
20 to the convening of the regular session of 2025, and a final
21 report of the state health services, workforce, and facilities

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1	plan, inc	luding its findings, recommendations, and any proposed
2	legislati	on, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
3	to the co	nvening of the regular session of 2026.
4	(j)	The hui hoʻomana shall be dissolved on July 1, 2026.

6	SECI	ION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
7	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
8	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for
9	administr	ative costs and to establish the following positions
10	within th	e state health planning and development agency:
11	(1)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) administrative
12		specialist IV position;
13	(2)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) research
14		statistician VI position, who shall serve as a state
15		health care informatician;
16	(3)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) research
17		statistician V position, who shall serve as an
18		administrative data specialist;
19	(4)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
20		VI position, who shall serve as a state health
21		planner;



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1	(5)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
2		IV position, who shall serve as a health planning
3		liaison for the county of Hawaii;
4	(6)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
5		IV position, who shall serve as a health planning
6		liaison for the county of Kauai;
7	(7)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
8		IV position, who shall serve as a health planning
9		liaison for the county of Maui; and
10	(8)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
11		IV position, who shall serve as a health planning
12		liaison for the city and county of Honolulu.
13	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
14	health fo	r the purposes of this Act.
15	SECT	ION 5. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of
16	the Const	itution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and
17	37-93, Ha	waii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
18	that the	appropriation contained in this Act will cause the
19	state gen	eral fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025
20	to be exc	eeded by \$, or per cent. The reasons
21	for excee	ding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the

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appropriation made in this Act is necessary to serve the public
 interest and to meet the needs provided for by this Act.
 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
