## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MISSING PERSONS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State must
- 2 protect vulnerable kupuna and persons with cognitive impairments
- 3 or developmental disabilities who are missing. More than half
- 4 of states nationwide have established silver alert programs
- 5 modeled after the AMBER Alert program.
- 6 Broadcasters use systems like the emergency alert system,
- 7 formerly known as the emergency broadcast system, or wireless
- 8 emergency alert, to communicate emergency alerts and warning
- 9 messages to the public.
- 10 There are many emergency situations where the use of these
- 11 broadcast systems could save lives by helping to identify
- 12 missing elderly individuals or persons with cognitive
- 13 impairments or developmental disabilities. However, there is no
- 14 statutory process that requires its use.
- 15 The purpose of this Act is to establish a silver alert
- 16 program within the department of law enforcement to alert the
- 17 public of missing persons for whom there is a credible threat to



- 1 their health and safety. To the greatest extent possible, the
- 2 alert shall provide protection of the privacy, dignity, and
- 3 independence of the missing person by including standards aimed
- 4 at preventing the inadvertent or unnecessary broadcasting or
- 5 dissemination of sensitive health and diagnostic information.
- 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 353C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 "§353C- Silver alert program; missing vulnerable
- 9 persons. (a) The department shall develop and implement a
- 10 silver alert program to rapidly disseminate information about a
- 11 person subject to the silver alert.
- 12 (b) If a person is reported missing to a law enforcement
- 13 agency and that agency determines that the requirements of
- 14 subsection (g) are met, the agency may request the department to
- 15 activate a silver alert. If the department concurs that the
- 16 requirements of subsection (g) are met, the department shall
- 17 activate a silver alert within the geographical area requested
- 18 by the investigating law enforcement agency.
- 19 (c) Radio, television, cable, and satellite systems are
- 20 encouraged to, but not required to, cooperate with disseminating
- 21 the information contained in a silver alert.

1	<u>(d)</u>	Upon activation of a silver alert, the department
2	shall ass	ist the investigating law enforcement agency by issuing
3	a be-on-t	he-lookout alert, issuing an electronic flyer, or
4	activatin	g a changeable message sign, as permissible.
5	(e)	The department may use, as permitted, the Wireless
6	Emergency	Alerts System.
7	<u>(f)</u>	The department may use, as permitted, a changeable
8	message sign if the following conditions are met:	
9	(1)	The investigating law enforcement agency determines
10		that a vehicle may be involved in the missing person
11		incident; and
12	(2)	Specific vehicle identification is available for
13		public dissemination.
14	<u>(g)</u>	A law enforcement agency may request from the
15	departmen	t that a silver alert be activated if the agency
16	determine	s that all of the following conditions are met
17	regarding	the investigation of the missing person:
18	(1)	The missing person is sixty-five years of age or
19		older, cognitively impaired, or developmentally
20		disabled;

(2)	The law enforcement agency has utilized all available
	local resources;
(3)	The law enforcement agency determines that the person
	has gone missing under unexplained or suspicious
	circumstances;
(4)	The law enforcement agency believes that the person is
	in danger because of age, health, mental or physical
	disability, or environment or weather conditions; the
	person is in the company of a potentially dangerous
	person; or there are other factors indicating that the
	person may be in peril; and
(5)	There is information available that, if disseminated
	to the public, could assist in the safe recovery of
	the missing person.
(h)	For purposes of this section:
"Cogi	nitively impaired" means affected by a cognitive
impairmen	t, as defined in section 431:10H-201.
"Deve	elopmentally disabled" means affected by a
developme	ntal disability, as defined in section 11-88.1-2 of the
Hawaii Adr	ministrative Rules.

1 "Silver alert" means a notification system, activated pursuant to this section, designed to issue and coordinate 2 alerts with respect to a situation that meets requirements of 3 4 subsection (g)." 5 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of or so much 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for 8 establishing and operating the silver alert program. 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of law enforcement for the purposes of this Act. 10 11 SECTION 4. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 12 13 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state 14 15 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be 16 exceeded by \$ per cent. In addition, the or appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund 17 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further 18 19 exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total 20 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling 21

- 1 for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
- 2 \$ or per cent. The reasons for exceeding the
- 3 general fund expenditure ceiling are that:
- 4 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
- 5 serve the public interest; and
- $\mathbf{6}$  (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
- 7 addressed by this Act.
- 8 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2042.
