A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREARMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a licensed citizen 2 legally carrying a concealed firearm in public must ensure that 3 the firearm is concealed completely. Having an improperly 4 concealed firearm can cause alarm to people in the area and will 5 result in 911 calls, burdening first responder resources. When 6 first responders approach a person carrying a firearm, it may be 7 unclear whether the person poses a threat, causing a potentially 8 hazardous situation for all involved.

9 Furthermore, a firearm that is dropped poses a risk of 10 discharging, endangering bystanders in the area. Aside from the 11 risk of accidental discharge, a dropped firearm may cause alarm 12 to a person nearby.

Lastly, a firearm negligently left behind by a licensee in
a public place could be stolen or used by another person to
commit a crime. Concealed carry licensee holders must be held
accountable to maintain possession of their concealed firearm.

1	The most effective way to mitigate these situations is for	
2	the firearm to be properly concealed and secured in accordance	
3	with the issued license and applicable laws.	
4	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to create a new	
5	offense within chapter 134, Hawaii Revised Statutes, relating to	
6	the negligent concealment of a firearm by a licensee.	
7	SECTION 2. Chapter 134, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
8	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
9	and to read as follows:	
10	" <u>§134-</u> Negligent concealment of a firearm by a	
11	licensee. (a) A person commits the offense of negligent	
12	concealment of a firearm by a licensee if the person holds a	
13	valid concealed carry firearms license and:	
14	(1)	Without legal justification, displays or fails to
15		completely conceal the licensed firearm, even briefly,
16		causing alarm to any other person; or
17	(2)	Fails to secure the firearm on their person by
18		dropping it in open view of any other person or by
19		leaving the firearm in a public place.
20	<u>(b)</u>	Negligent concealment of a firearm by a licensee is a
21	petty misdemeanor."

SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
 begun before its effective date.

4 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
