RELATING TO NEONICOTINOIDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that neonicotinoid
insecticides are neurotoxic insecticides that permanently bind
to, and subsequently overstimulate and destroy, insect nerve
cells. Neonicotinoids are the most widely used class of
insecticides worldwide.

6 The legislature further finds that research overwhelmingly shows that neonicotinoid pesticides have destructive impacts on 7 8 pollinator populations, killing bees, butterflies, and birds, 9 and pose a serious threat to food systems, ecosystems, and 10 public health. Growing scientific evidence also suggests that 11 neonicotinoids have serious negative health impacts for humans. 12 Neonicotinoid contamination is common in water supplies, food, and human bodies. 13
