### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is SECTION 1.
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "§321- PFAS testing grant program. (a) There is
- 5 established a PFAS testing grant program to be developed and
- 6 administered by the department of health in collaboration with
- 7 the university of Hawaii.
- 8 The PFAS testing grant program shall provide funding
- 9 to assist communities, businesses, and residents throughout the
- 10 State in obtaining testing services and biological sampling to
- 11 identify and detect perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl
- 12 substances (PFAS), also known as "forever chemicals", in water,
- 13 soil, dust, crops, food, packaging, consumer products, and other
- 14 substances and materials.
- 15 (c) The department of health may award grants based on
- 16 criteria that shall be developed by the department.

3	(1)	Any grant shall be used exclusively for the purposes
4		of the program;
5	(2)	The grantee shall comply with all applicable federal
6		and state laws prohibiting discrimination against any

8		religion, creed, sex, age, sexual orientation,
9		disability, or any other characteristic protected
10		under applicable federal or state law;
11	(3)	The grant shall not be used for purposes of
12		entertainment or perquisites;
13	(4)	All activities undertaken with grant funds received
14		shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and
15		county statutes and ordinances;
16	<u>(5)</u>	The grantee shall:
17		(A) Indemnify and hold harmless the State and its

3	(B)	Obtain sufficient insurance to provide the	
4		indemnification under subparagraph (A), if	
5		requested to do so by the department of health;

7	(6) The	grantee shall agree to make available to the	
8	depa	rtment of health all records the grantee may have	
9	rela	ting to the grant to monitor the grantee's	
10	comp	liance with the requirements of the program.	
11	(e) The	department of health shall adopt rules to carry	
12	out the purpos	es of the grant program. The grant applications	
13	shall be revie	wed and approved by an administrative staff member	
14	of the departm	ent."	
15	SECTION 2	. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of	
16	the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,		
17	Hawaii Revised	Statutes, the legislature has determined that the	
18	appropriations	contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023,	
19	and this Act w	ill cause the state general fund expenditure	
20	ceiling for fi	scal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by

- 2 year 2024-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act
- 3 only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure
- 4 ceiling are that:
- 5 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
- 6 serve the public interest; and
- 7 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
- 8 addressed by this Act.
- 9 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 11 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for
- 12 the PFAS testing grant program.
- 13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 14 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.

### Report Title:

DOH; University of Hawaii; PFAS Testing Grant Program; Expenditure Ceiling; Appropriation

### Description:

Establishes the PFAS Testing Grant Program within the Department of Health to provide funding to assist communities, businesses, and residents throughout the State in obtaining testing services and biological sampling to identify and detect perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances. Declares that the general fund expenditure ceiling is exceeded. Makes an appropriation.
