A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 141, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new part I to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	" <u>§14</u>	1- Healthy soils program; established. (a) The	
5	departmen	t of agriculture shall establish a healthy soils	
6	program. The department of agriculture may consult with or		
7	contract a third-party for any needed expertise to perform its		
8	duties pursuant to this section. The healthy soils program		
9	shall:		
10	(1)	Create a statewide soil health assessment with a list	
11		of practices specific to the State that are most	
12		effective in improving soil health and building soil	
13		carbon stocks;	
14	(2)	Provide farmers with education and technical	
15		assistance to implement farm management practices that	
16		contribute to healthy soils;	

1	<u>(3)</u>	Establish standards that apply to the healthy soils
2		program and are based on the findings of the
3		greenhouse gas sequestration task force established
4		pursuant to section 225P-4 relating to minimum levels
5		of soil carbon and water content and required soil
6		health practices; and
7	(4)	Subject to available funding, issue awards and other
8		financial incentives to implement farm management
9		practices that contribute to healthy soils.
10	<u>(b)</u>	The long-term goals of the healthy soils program shall
11	be to est	ablish:
12	(1)	Deadlines by which all awards issued by the department
13		of agriculture shall meet the standards established
14		pursuant to subsection (a)(3);
15	(2)	Deadlines by which a plan for all state lands leased
16		for agricultural use shall be required; and
17	(3)	Programs incentivizing small farmers, ranchers, and
18		landowners to take carbon negative actions on their
19		respective lands.
20	(c)	The department of agriculture shall submit a report
21	detailing	the status and progress of the healthy soils program

- 1 and its recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to
- 2 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
- 3 of each regular session."
- 4 SECTION 2. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 5 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
- 6 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
- 7 appropriations contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023,
- 8 and this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure
- 9 ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
- 10 \$ or per cent. This current declaration takes
- 11 into account general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal
- 12 year 2024-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act
- 13 only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure
- 14 ceiling are that:
- 15 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
- serve the public interest; and
- 17 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
- 18 addressed by this Act.
- 19 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000 or so much
- 21 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the

- 1 establishment of the healthy soils program and to issue awards
- 2 and other financial incentives pursuant to the program.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
