### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STUDENT OUT-OF-SERVICE-AREA ATTENDANCE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that overcrowding in
- 2 schools negatively affects student achievement levels, stress
- 3 levels, attendance, and concentration. School overcrowding also
- 4 has a detrimental effect on teacher morale and limits the time
- 5 available for teachers to adequately plan and deliver lectures.
- 6 The legislature further finds that multi-tracking is an
- 7 approach used to address school overcrowding by dividing
- 8 students and faculty into multiple groups who attend school
- 9 year-round on alternating schedules. However, multi-tracked
- 10 schools have tested an average of two per cent lower than
- 11 students in traditional schools on national reading, math, and
- 12 language assessments. Studies have also shown that
- 13 multi-tracking is more expensive over the long term and can harm
- 14 community and family cohesion and lead to increased stress and
- 15 burnout for students, teachers, and parents.
- 16 The legislature believes that school overcrowding and the
- 17 need for multi-tracking in the Kapolei complex has been



- 1 partially caused by the mandatory reassignment of students who
- 2 would otherwise attend a school in the Nanakuli complex.
- 3 Assigning these students to schools in their own Nanakuli
- 4 complex would help balance the distribution of students among
- 5 the complex areas within the Leeward district and ease
- 6 overcrowding in the Kapolei complex without the need to
- 7 multi-track.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to gradually end the department
- 9 of education's practice of mandating that students attend a
- 10 school outside their service area.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 302A-1143, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- "\$302A-1143 Attending school in [what] a service area. A
- 14 person of school age shall be required to attend the school of
- 15 the service area, as determined by the department, in which the
- 16 person resides, unless:
- 17 (1) The person is enrolled in a Hawaiian language medium
- 18 education program or charter school;
- 19 (2) A geographic exception to attend a school in another
- 20 service area is requested and granted at the

3	(4)	The person is enrolled in a career and technical
4		education program under section 302A-1143.5."
5	SECT	ION 3. The department of education shall reduce the
6	out-of-se	rvice-area attendance mandated by the department of
7	education	as follows:
8	(1)	For the 2024-2025 school year, the number of sixth
9		grade students mandated by the department of education
10		for out-of-service-area attendance shall not be more
11		than eighty per cent of the sixth grade students
12		mandated for out-of-service-area attendance during the
13		2022-2023 school year;
14	(2)	For the 2025-2026 school year, the number of sixth
15		grade students mandated by the department of education
16		for out-of-service-area attendance shall not be more
17		than sixty per cent of the sixth grade students
18		mandated for out-of-service-area attendance during the
19		2022-2023 school year;
20	(3)	For the 2026-2027 school year, the number of sixth
21		grade students mandated by the department of education

1		for out-of-service-area attendance shall not be more	
2		than forty per cent of the sixth grade students	
3		mandated for out-of-service-area attendance during the	
4		2022-2023 school year; and	
5	(4)	For the 2027-2028 school year, the number of sixth	
6		grade students mandated by the department of education	
7		for out-of-service-area attendance shall not be more	
8		than twenty per cent of the sixth grade students	
9		mandated for out-of-service-area attendance during the	
10		2022-2023 school year.	
11	SECT:	ION 4. No later than twenty days prior to the	
12	convening	of the regular sessions of 2026, 2027, 2028, 2029, and	
13	2030, the department of education shall submit a report to the		
14	legislature on its progress to comply with this Act. The report		
15	shall also include information, beginning with the 2022-2023		
16	school year, on the number of students statewide in each grade		
17	that have been mandated by the department of education for		
18	out-of-service-area attendance.		
19	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed		
20	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.	

- 1 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 2 provided that section 2 shall take effect July 1, 2028.
