A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION FUNDING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Reinventing
- 2 Education Act of 2004 (Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004)
- 3 established a weighted student formula to allocate moneys to
- 4 schools according to the different costs of educating students
- 5 with different needs.
- 6 The legislature further finds that despite the intended
- 7 equitable distribution of funds, the weighted student formula
- 8 has placed small and remote schools at a disadvantage. In the
- 9 case of Hana high and elementary school, for example, the
- 10 budgetary shortfall has resulted in the loss of several well-
- 11 qualified teachers and has threatened the school's ability to
- 12 offer minimum course requirements for students to earn high
- 13 school diplomas. As of 2005, six schools were excepted from
- 14 weighted student formula allocations. The legislature
- 15 additionally finds that small and remote schools should be
- 16 adequately funded to retain the minimal personnel and resources
- 17 necessary to deliver a quality education to students.



1	Acco	rdingly, the purpose of this Act is to improve the
2	fiscal eq	uity for small and remote schools by requiring the
3	departmen	t of education's committee on weights to consider any
4	inequitie	s of negative consequences of its weighted student
5	formula o	n small and remote schools.
6	SECT	ION 2. Section 302a-1303.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
7	is amende	d to read as follows:
8	" §30	2A-1303.5 Committee on weights. (a) There is
9	establish	ed within the department [of education] the committee
10	on weight	s to develop a weighted student formula pursuant to
11	section 3	02A-1303.6. The committee [may:] shall:
12	(1)	Create a list of student characteristics that will be
13		weighted;
14	(2)	Create a system of weights based upon the student
15		characteristics that may be applied to determine the
16		relative cost of educating any student;
17	(3)	Determine specific student weights, including their
18		unit value;
19	(4)	Determine which moneys shall be included in the amount
20		of funds to be allocated through the weighted student
21		formula;

1	(5)	Recommend a weighted student formula to the board [of
2		education];
3	(6)	Perform any other function that may facilitate the
4		implementation of the weighted student formula; and
5	(7)	Meet not less than once every odd-numbered year, to
6		review the weighted student formula and, if the
7		committee deems it necessary, recommend a new weighted
8		student formula for adoption by the board [ef
9		education.];
10	provided	that the committee, when developing its weighted
11	student f	ormula recommendations, shall consider any inequities
12	or negati	ve consequences of its weighted student formula funding
13	recommend	ations on small and remote schools, report these
14	inequitie	s or negative consequences to the board, and provide
15	funding a	djustment recommendations to ameliorate these
16	inequitie	s or negative consequences.
17	(b)	The composition of the committee on weights shall be
18	determine	d by the board [of education] based on recommendations
19	from the	superintendent [of education] and dean of the
20	[Universi	ty] university of Hawaii at Manoa college of education
21	and inclu	de principals, teachers, and other members with the

- 1 appropriate professional skills, experiences, and qualifications
- 2 needed to facilitate the work of the committee. The
- 3 superintendent or the superintendent's designee shall chair the
- 4 committee on weights.
- 5 (c) The committee on weights may form advisory
- 6 subcommittees to obtain input from key stakeholders as
- 7 determined necessary by the committee.
- 8 (d) The members of the committee on weights shall serve at
- 9 the pleasure of the board [of education] and shall not be
- 10 subject to section 26-34. Members of the committee on weights
- 11 shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for
- 12 expenses, including travel expenses, necessary for the
- 13 performance of their duties.
- (e) For the purposes of subsection (a), "small and remote
- 15 school" means a public school except for a public school
- 16 governed by chapter 302D, that is:
- 17 (1) Located at least a one-hour drive away from the
- nearest public high school;
- 19 (2) Located on the islands of Lanai, Molokai, or Niihau;
- 20 (3) An elementary school with a student enrollment of less
- 21 than two hundred students; or

1	(4) A secondary school with a student enrollment of less
2	than four hundred students."
3	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
4	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
5	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
