A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AIR POLLUTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that air and noise
- 2 pollution from two-stroke engines is extremely detrimental to
- 3 the quality of life for Hawaii's residents. The legislature
- 4 further finds that, according to a 2015 study based on data from
- 5 the United States Environmental Protection Agency, two-stroke
- 6 engines are a major source of volatile organic compounds and
- 7 criteria pollutants, such as carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides,
- 8 and carbon dioxide, which cause harmful air pollution.
- 9 Additionally, the use of two-stroke engines increases the risk
- 10 of gasoline spills and fire. Moreover, according to the United
- 11 States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, gas-powered
- 12 lawn mowers and leaf blowers operate at approximately eighty to
- 13 eighty-five decibels and can cause hearing damage after only two
- 14 hours of exposure.
- 15 Currently, string trimmers, which are often referred to as
- 16 "weed wackers", and leaf blowers are the most common machines
- 17 powered by two-stroke engines in Hawaii. The legislature finds

- 1 that, after the initial costs of switching from two-stroke
- 2 engines to electric motors, electric motors are less costly to
- 3 operate and maintain compared to gasoline-powered two-stroke
- 4 engines.
- 5 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to reduce air and
- 6 noise pollution in Hawaii by prohibiting the use of leaf blowers
- 7 and string trimmers that are powered by two-stroke engines
- 8 beginning January 1, 2028.
- 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 342B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately
- 11 designated and to read as follows:
- 12 "§342B- Leaf blowers and string trimmers; two-stroke
- 13 engines; prohibited. (a) Beginning January 1, 2028, no person
- 14 shall operate a:
- 15 (1) Leaf blower; or
- 16 (2) String trimmer,
- 17 that is powered using a two-stroke engine in the State.
- (b) Any person who violates this section shall be fined
- 19 \$50 for the first violation, \$100 for the second violation, \$200
- 20 for the third violation, and \$500 for each subsequent violation.
- 21 (c) For purposes of this section:

| 9 | SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that |
| 10 | matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were |
| 11 | begun before its effective date. |
| 12 | SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored. |
| 13 | SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. |

Description:

Beginning 1/1/2028, prohibits the operation of leaf blowers or string trimmers that are powered using two-stroke engines. Establishes penalties to be enforced by the Department of Health.
