BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 342B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately
- 3 designated and to read as follows:
- 4 "\$342B- Solid waste electric generating facilities; air
- 5 pollutants; emission limits. (a) An owner or operator of a
- 6 solid waste electric generating facility shall ensure that each
- 7 incinerator operating as part of the facility has implemented
- 8 air pollution controls sufficient to limit the emissions of:
- 9 (1) Nitrogen oxides;
- 10 (2) Mercury;
- 11 (3) Dioxins; and
- 12 (4) Any other air pollutant specified by the director by
- rule,
- 14 to not more than forty-five parts per million for each air
- 15 pollutant, measured on an average daily basis; provided that the
- 16 director may specify a lower level for each air pollutant by
- 17 rule.

4	SECTION 2. Section 342B-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

9	municipal solid waste."

Report Title:

Department of Health; Air Pollution; Solid Waste Electric Generating Facilities; Air Pollution Controls; Emission Limits

Description:

Requires an owner or operator of a solid waste electric generating facility to ensure that each incinerator operating as part of the facility has implemented air pollution controls sufficient to limit the emissions of nitrogen oxides, mercury, dioxins, and other air pollutants specified by the Director of Health to not more than 45 parts per million for each air pollutant, measured on an average daily basis. Authorizes the Director of Health to specify lower emission limits by rule.
