A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 19-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

2 amended to read as follows:

3 "\$19-3 Election frauds. The following persons shall be

4 deemed guilty of an election fraud:

- 5 (1)Every person who, directly or indirectly, personally 6 or through another, gives, procures, or lends, or 7 agrees or offers to give, procure, or lend, or who 8 endeavors to procure, any money or office or place of 9 employment or valuable consideration to or for any 10 elector, person for an elector, person in order to 11 induce any elector to vote or refrain from voting, or 12 to vote or refrain from voting for any particular 13 person or party, or who does any such act on account 14 of any person having voted or refrained from voting 15 for any particular person at any election;
- 16 (2) Every person who advances or pays, or causes to be
 17 paid, any money to, or to the use of, any other

person, with the intent that the money, or any part
thereof, shall be expended in bribery at any election,
or for any purpose connected with or incidental to any
election; or who knowingly pays or causes to be paid
any money to any person in the discharge or repayment
of any money wholly or partly expended in bribery at
any election, or for any purpose connected with or
incidental to any election;

- election, directly or indirectly, personally or through another, receives, agrees, or contracts for any money, gift, loan, or valuable consideration, office, place, or employment for oneself or any other person for voting or agreeing to vote, or for refraining to vote or agreeing to refrain from voting, or for voting or refraining to vote for any particular person or party;
 - (4) Every person who, directly or indirectly, personally or through another, makes use of, or threatens to make use of, any force, violence, or restraint; or inflicts or threatens to inflict any injury, damage, or loss in

1		any manner, or in any way practices intimidation upon
2		or against any person in order to induce or compel the
3		person to vote or refrain from voting, or to vote or
4		refrain from voting for any particular person or
5		party, at any election, or on account of the person
6		having voted or refrained from voting, or voted or
7		refrained from voting for any particular person or
8		party; or who by abduction, distress, or any device or
9		contrivance impedes, prevents, or otherwise interferes
10		with the free exercise of the elective franchise;
11		provided that the practice of intimidation as
12		described in this paragraph includes, among other
13		actions:
14		(A) The carrying of any firearm or weapon; and
15		(B) The act of photographing the face of any voter
16		without permission from both the voter and an
17		appropriate election official,
18		at or within feet any voter service center,
19		place of deposit, or polling place;
20	(5)	Every person who, at any election, votes or attempts
21		to vote in the name of any other person, living or

1	dead, or in some fictitious name, or who votes or
2	attempts to vote more than once during any election,
3	regardless of whether one of the elections is in a
4	state or territory of the United States outside of
5	Hawaii, or knowingly gives or attempts to give more
6	than one ballot for the same office at one time of
7	voting; provided that a person does not commit an
8	election fraud if the person votes once in Hawaii's
9	primary election and also votes in the primary
10	election of another state or territory during the same
11	year, so long as the person was properly registered to
12	vote in all such elections. For the purposes of this
13	paragraph, a person is properly registered to vote if
14	the person's residence in the state in which [they
15	are] the person is currently voting was acquired with
16	the intent to make that state [their] the person's
17	legal residence with all the accompanying obligations
18	therein, and if, at the time of voting, that person is
19	registered to vote with the office of elections of the
20	state in which [they are] the person is voting;

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1	(6)	Every person who, before or during an election
2		knowingly publishes a false statement of the
3		withdrawal of any candidate at the election;

- (7) Every person who induces or procures any person to withdraw from being a candidate at an election in consideration of any payment or gift or valuable consideration; or of any threat; and every candidate who withdraws from being a candidate in pursuance of such inducement or procurement;
- (8) Every public officer by law required to do or perform any act or thing with reference to any of the provisions in any law concerning elections who wilfully fails, neglects, or refuses to do or perform the same, or who is guilty of any wilful violation of any of the provisions thereof;
- (9) Any person wilfully tampering or attempting to tamper with, disarrange, deface, or impair in any manner whatsoever, or destroy any voting machine while the same is in use at any election, or who, after the machine is locked in order to preserve the registration or record of any election made by the

1		same, tampers or attempts to tamper with any voting
2		machine;
3	(10)	Every person who, directly or indirectly, personally
4		or through another, wilfully designs, alters,
5		accesses, or programs any electronic voting system to
6		cause the system to inaccurately record, tally, or
7		report votes cast on the electronic voting system;
8	(11)	Every person who assists a voter in the completion of
9		a ballot in violation of section 11-139; and
10	(12)	Every person who knowingly broadcasts, televises,
11		circulates, publishes, distributes, or otherwise
12		communicates, including by electronic means or
13		advertisement, false information about the time, date,
14		place, or means of voting with the purpose of
15		impeding, preventing, or otherwise interfering with
16		the free exercise of the elective franchise."
17	SECT	ION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
18	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
19	begun bef	ore its effective date.
20	SECT	ION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Election Fraud; Intimidation; Firearms; Weapons; Photography; Voters

Description:

Specifies that the practice of election fraud intimidation includes carrying any firearm or weapon and photographing the face of any voter without permission from both the voter and an appropriate election official when those actions occur at or near a voter service center, place of deposit, or polling place.
