A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CANCER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the university of
- 2 Hawaii cancer center is one of seventy-one National Cancer
- 3 Institute-designated cancer centers in the United States. It is
- 4 the only center in Hawaii and the Pacific region. The
- 5 legislature also finds that the university of Hawaii cancer
- 6 center reduces the burden of cancer through research, education,
- 7 patient care, and community outreach, with an emphasis on the
- 8 unique ethnic, cultural, and environmental characteristics of
- 9 Hawaii and the Pacific region.
- 10 Cancer incidence and mortality rates have decreased in
- 11 Hawaii over the last decade, but despite this overall reduction,
- 12 the disparities between ethnic populations continue to be of
- 13 concern. Native Hawaiians continue to have the highest cancer
- 14 incidence and mortality rates among men and women, including
- 15 higher incidences of breast and ovarian cancers. Similarly,
- 16 Filipino women have the highest incidences of ovarian and
- 17 thyroid cancer. The legislature finds that cancer research

- 1 focusing on Native Hawaiians, Pacific Islanders, and Filipinos
- 2 is a matter of statewide concern and is unique to Hawaii and the
- 3 university of Hawaii cancer center and thus cannot be easily
- 4 conducted anywhere else in the world.
- 5 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
- 6 university of Hawaii cancer center for a multiethnic cohort
- 7 study focusing on the social determinants of health, lifestyles,
- 8 environmental exposures, and resilience factors of Native
- 9 Hawaiians, Pacific Islanders, and Filipinos; provided that the
- 10 university of Hawaii obtains, at a minimum, matching federal
- 11 funds to conduct the study.
- 12 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 14 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for
- 15 the university of Hawaii cancer center to conduct a multiethnic
- 16 cohort study focusing on the social determinants of health,
- 17 lifestyles, environmental exposures, and resilience factors of
- 18 Native Hawaiians, Pacific Islanders, and Filipinos; provided
- 19 that no funds shall be made available under this Act unless the
- 20 university of Hawaii obtains, at a minimum, matching federal
- 21 funds to conduct the study.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the university of
- 2 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 4 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
- 5 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
- 6 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state
- 7 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be
- 8 exceeded by \$ or per cent. In addition, the
- 9 appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund
- 10 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further
- 11 exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total
- 12 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these
- 13 two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling
- 14 for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
- 15 \$ or per cent. The reasons for exceeding the
- 16 general fund expenditure ceiling are that:
- 17 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
- serve the public interest; and
- 19 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
- addressed by this Act.
- 21 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.

Report Title:

UH; Cancer Center; Multiethnic Cohort Study; Matching Funds; Expenditure Ceiling; Appropriation

Description:

Appropriates funds to the University of Hawaii Cancer Center to conduct a multiethnic cohort study focusing on the social determinants of health, lifestyles, environmental exposures, and resilience factors of Native Hawaiians, Pacific Islanders, and Filipinos; provided that the University of Hawaii shall obtain, at a minimum, matching federal funds to conduct the study. Declares that the general fund expenditure ceiling is exceeded. (SD1)

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
