A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE CESSPOOL CONVERSION FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PILOT PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that Act 125, Session SECTION 1. 2 Laws of Hawaii 2017 (Act 125), codified at section 342D-72, 3 Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires all cesspools in the State, unless exempted, to be upgraded or converted to a different type 4 5 of approved wastewater system or connected to a sewerage system before January 1, 2050. Act 125 also requires the department of 6 7 health to investigate the number, scope, location, and priority 8 of cesspools statewide that require upgrade, conversion, or 9 connection, based on each cesspool's impact on public health and 10 submit a report to the legislature.

In December 2017, the department of health submitted a report to the legislature, identifying fourteen priority areas of the State where cesspool upgrades are critically needed to protect public health and the environment. The report identified the upcountry area of Maui and Kahaluu area of Oahu as level one priority areas.

1 Specifically with regards to the upcountry area of Maui, the department of health, in a press release dated December 19, 2 3 2017, announced that the findings in its December 2017 report 4 were troubling and show wastewater from cesspools is beginning to impact drinking water in some parts of upcountry Maui. The 5 department of health further stated that although the water in 6 7 these areas is still safe to drink, action must be taken to protect the future of drinking water and the environment. 8 9 Despite the reported need to expeditiously upgrade or convert 10 cesspools in the upcountry area of Maui, the legislature finds 11 that many owners of properties with cesspools in the area lack 12 the resources to address the matter.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a three-year pilot program within the department of health to provide financial assistance to qualified owners of cesspools located in the county of Maui to upgrade or convert their cesspools to a wastewater system approved by the director of health or connect them to a sewerage system.

19 SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the department 20 of health, a three-year pilot program to be known as the 21 cesspool conversion financial assistance pilot program to

13		a sewerage system; and	
14	(2)	A direct replacement program that pays for the total	
15		cost to upgrade or convert the cesspool owned by the	
16		qualified applicant to a director-approved wastewater	
17		system or connect the cesspool to a sewerage system;	
18	provided that the department shall administer the financial		
19	assistance under the pilot program to qualified applicants on a		
20	first-come-first-served basis; provided further that the total		
21	amount of	financial assistance shall not exceed \$ for

3	(c) The department of health shall adopt rules in				
4	accordance with chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to carry				
5	out the purposes of this Act. The rules shall include, at				
6	minimum, the eligibility criteria and application process for				
7	the pilot program.				
8	(d) The department of health shall submit a report of its				
9	findings and recommendations relating to the pilot program to				
10	the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening				
11	of the regular session of 2027. The report shall include:				
12	(1) An evaluation of the pilot program's effectiveness,				
13	including:				
14	(A) The total amount of financial assistance provided				
15	to owners of cesspools under the pilot program;				
16	(B) The total number of owners that received				
17	financial assistance from the pilot program;				
18	(C) The total number of cesspools that have been				
19	upgraded or converted to a director-approved				
20	wastewater system and the total number of				
21	cesspools connected to a sewerage system

2		program; and			
3	(D)	Any other information that the department of			
4		health deems useful in assessing the pilot			
5		<pre>program's effectiveness;</pre>			
6	(2) A r	ecommendation as to whether the pilot program			
7	sho	uld be extended or expanded to different priority			
8	are	as identified in the December 2017 report; and			
9	(3) Any	proposed legislation.			
10	(e) As	used in this Act, unless the context clearly			
11	requires otherwise:				
12	"December 2017 report" means the report dated December				
13	2017, that was issued and submitted by the department of health				
14	to the legislature in response to Act 125, Session Laws of				
15	Hawaii 2017.				
16	"Pilot program" means the cesspool conversion financial				
17	assistance pilot program established pursuant to subsection (a).				
18	"Qualified applicant" means any person who owns a cesspool				
19	within the county of Maui, identified in the December 2017				
20	report as "Priority Area 1", and meets the eligibility criteria				



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set forth in the rules adopted by the department of health
 pursuant to this Act.

SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
appropriations contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023,
and this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure
ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by

9 \$ or per cent. This current declaration takes 10 into account general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal 11 year 2024-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act 12 only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure 13 ceiling are that:

- 14 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to15 serve the public interest; and
- 16 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs17 addressed by this Act.

18 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the 21 establishment, implementation, and operation of the cesspool

1 conversion financial assistance pilot program established

2 pursuant to section 2 of this Act.

3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of4 health for the purposes of this Act.

5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.

Description:

Establishes within the Department of Health, a three-year Cesspool Conversion Financial Assistance Pilot Program to provide financial assistance to owners of cesspools located in the county of Maui to upgrade or convert their cesspools to a wastewater system approved by the Director of Health or connect them to a sewerage system. Requires the Department of Health to adopt rules and submit a report to the Legislature. Makes an appropriation.
