A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) There is established within the department
2	of health	for administrative purposes a rural health task force.
3	The task	force shall consist of the following members:
4	(1)	The director of health, or the director's designee,
5		who shall serve as the chairperson;
6	(2)	The rural health communities coordinator of the office
7		of primary care and rural health of the department of
8		health;
9	(3)	The supervisor of the Maui public health nursing
10		section of the department of health, or the
11		supervisor's designee;
12	(4)	The supervisor of the Molokai public health nursing
13		office of the department of health, or the
14		supervisor's designee;
15	(5)	The supervisor of the Lanai public health nursing
16		office of the department of health, or the
17		supervisor's designee; and

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1	(6)	One representative from each of the following rural						
2		health care facilities, to be invited by the						
3		chairperson:						
4		(A) Hana Community Health Center;						
5		(B) Molokai General Hospital;						
6		(C) Lanai Community Health Center; and						
7		(D) Molokai Community Health Center.						
8	(b)	The task force shall prepare and develop solutions and						
9	make reco	mmendations regarding the recruitment of registered						
10	nurses, a	ccountability and management of registered nurse						
11	retention	, and facility-specific needs for the health care						
12	sector in	rural areas of east Maui, Molokai, and Lanai. The						
13	task forc	e shall base its plans and solutions on studies and						
14	data related to improving the recruitment of registered nurses							
15	in rural	areas and retention of registered nurses based on a						
16	nurse-to-	patient ratio. The duties of the task force shall						
17	include b	ut are not limited to:						
18	(1)	Taking account of the needs of rural health care						
19		facilities in east Maui, Molokai, and Lanai;						

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1	(2)	Managing the ratio of registered nurses to patients in
2		each rural health care facility in east Maui, Molokai,
3		and Lanai;
4	(3)	Developing recommendations for affordable workforce
5		housing to manage retention of registered nurses;
6	(4)	Surveying the demand for telehealth-based medical
7		direction;
8	(5)	Considering further retention options, including
9		travel nurses;
10	(6)	Analyzing the impact nurse retention has on rural
11		health care facilities; and
12	(7)	Researching current best practices on retaining
13		registered nurses.
14	(c)	Members of the task force shall serve without
15	compensati	ion but shall be reimbursed for their actual and
16	necessary	expenses, including travel expenses, incurred in

carrying out their official duties pursuant to this Act.

Description:

Establishes the Rural Health Task Force within the Department of Health to make recommendations on registered nurse recruitment and retention in rural areas of east Maui, Molokai, and Lanai.

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
