RELATING TO EXEMPT POSITIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTI	ON 1. Section 26-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
3	"(b)	The department shall:
4	(1)	Preaudit and conduct after-the-fact audits of the
5		financial accounts of all state departments to
6		determine the legality of expenditures and the
7		accuracy of accounts;
8	(2)	Report to the governor and to each regular session of
9		the legislature as to the finances of each department
10		of the State;
11	(3)	Administer the state risk management program;
12	(4)	Establish and manage motor pools;
13	(5)	Manage the preservation and disposal of all records of
14		the State;
15	(6)	Undertake the program of centralized engineering and
16		office leasing services, including operation and
17		maintenance and lease buyback processing pursuant to



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1		subsection (d) of public buildings, for departments of			
2		the State;			
3	(7)	Undertake the functions of the state surveyor;			
4	(8)	Establish accounting and internal control systems;			
5	(9)	Under the direction of the chief information officer,			
6		provide centralized computer information management			
7		and processing services;			
8	(10)	Establish a program to provide a means for public			
9		access to public information and develop an			
10		information network for state government;			
11	(11)	Assume administrative responsibility for the office of			
12		information practices; [and]			
13	(12)	Have the discretion to employ persons within the			
14		comptroller's office who shall be exempt from chapters			
15		76 and 89 in support of communications, change			
16		management, and business process improvement programs			
17		as part of the State's information technology			
18		modernization efforts; provided that the persons shall			
19		be members of the state employees' retirement system			
20		and shall be eligible to receive the benefits of any

3	[(12)]	(13)	Approve state fleet acquisitions; provided that:
4		(A)	Beginning January 1, 2022, all new light-duty
5			motor vehicles that are passenger cars purchased
6			for the State's fleet shall be zero-emission
7			vehicles;
8		(B)	Beginning as soon as practicable but no later
9			than January 1, 2030, all new light-duty motor
10			vehicles that are multipurpose passenger vehicles
11			and trucks for the State's fleet shall be zero-
12			emission vehicles; and
13		(C)	The comptroller may authorize an exemption for
14			new fleet vehicle purchases if zero-emission
15			vehicles are demonstrated to be cost-prohibitive
16			on a lifecycle basis or unsuitable for the
17			vehicles' planned purpose, or if funds are
18			unavailable.

 contained in title 10 Code [+]of[+] Federal Regulations part

5 meaning as contained in title 49 Code of Federal Regulations

7 "Passenger car" shall have the same meaning as contained in
8 title 49 Code of Federal Regulations section 571.3.

9 "Truck" shall have the same meaning as contained in
10 title 49 Code of Federal Regulations section 571.3.

11 "Zero-emission vehicle" shall have the same meaning as 12 contained in title 40 Code of Federal Regulations section 13 88.102-94."

16 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.
