#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ALLOWANCE ON SERVICE RETIREMENTS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 Section 88-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is SECTION 1.
- 2 amended by adding five new definitions to be appropriately
- 3 inserted and to read as follows:



Retirement for Public Officers and Employees; Allowances; Pension and Retirement Systems; Law Enforcement Employees

Amends chapter 88, HRS, to include new definitions for certain law enforcement administrators and employees established in Act 278, SLH 2022, as class A members of the pension and retirement systems and provides guidance for the computation of retirement benefits similar to police officers.
