A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 127A-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted 3 and to read as follows: ""Federally declared disaster" has the same meaning as 4 defined in title 26 United States Code section 165." 5 SECTION 2. Section 127A-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 7 amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows: 8 The agency shall perform emergency management functions within the territorial limits of the State. In 9 10 performing its duties, the agency shall: 11 (1) Prepare a state comprehensive emergency management plan, which shall be integrated into and coordinated 12 13 with the emergency management plans of the federal 14 government. The plan shall be integrated by a 15

continuous, integrated comprehensive emergency management program. The plan shall contain provisions to ensure that the State is prepared for emergencies

11		executive orders, proclamations, and rules for
