RELATING TO THE STATE HEALTH PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT AGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1.	Section	323D-12,	Hawaii	Revised	Statutes,	is
2	amended to read	as follow	vs:				

3 "\$323D-12 Health planning and development functions; state
4 agency. (a) The state agency shall:

5	(1)	Have as a principal function the responsibility for
6		promoting [accessibility for all the people of the
7		State to quality health care services at reasonable
8		cost. The state agency shall conduct such studies and

- 9 investigations as may be necessary as to the causes of
- 10 health care costs including inflation. The state
- 11 agency may contract for services to implement this
- 12 paragraph. The certificate of need program mandated
- 13 under part V shall serve this function. The state
- 14 agency shall-promote-the-sharing of facilities or
- 15 services by health care providers whenever possible to
- 16 achieve economies and shall restrict unusual-or
- 17 unusually costly services to individual facilities or



1		providers where appropriate;] universal access to high
2		quality, equitable, and affordable health care for all
3		the people of the State. For the purposes of this
4		section, "health care" means the improvement of health
5		via the prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and
6		amelioration or cure of disease, illness, injury, and
7		other physical and mental impairments in people that
8		is delivered in any setting;
9	(2)	[Serve-as staff to and provide-technical assistance
10		and advice to the statewide council and the subarea
11		councils in the preparation, review, and revision of
12		the state health services and facilities plan;]
13		Provide leadership and coordination of activities and
14		resources throughout State agencies that affect health
15		care access and quality, including but not limited to
16		health insurance coverage rates, health insurance
17		benefits, affordability, workforce, reimbursement,
18		quality, administrative simplification, and health
19		information technology;
20	(3)	[Conduct the health planning activities of the State
21		in coordination with the subarea councils, implement



1		the state health services and facilities plan, and
2		determine the statewide health needs of the State
3		after-consulting with the statewide council; and]
4		Issue a state health services and facilities plan,
5		which shall include workforce considerations, and
6		update the plan every four years after consulting with
7		the statewide council;
8	(4)	Administer the state certificate of need program
9		pursuant to part V[$ au$], and serve as staff and provide
10		technical assistance and advice to the statewide
11		council and subarea councils; and
12	(5)	Develop, no later than 2027, and annually thereafter,
13		and in consultation with the governor, the department
14		of budget and finance, the employee-union trust fund,
15		all public and private health plans and entities in
16		the State providing health insurance coverage, an
17		annual state global budget based on total costs of
18		health care in order to prevent costs from rising
19		faster than general inflation and to assure the
20		affordability of health care services.
21	(b)	The state agency may:



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1	(1)	Prepare [such] reports <u>, related to statistics as</u>
2		needed to monitor and improve health care access,
3		outcomes, equity, quality, costs and cost-
4		effectiveness, and recommendations on Hawaii's health
5		care costs and public or private efforts to reduce or
6		control costs and <u>improve</u> health care quality as it
7		deems necessary. The report may $include[_{ au}]$ but not be
8		limited to[$_{ au}$] a review of health insurance plans, the
9		availability of various kinds of health insurance and
10		malpractice insurance to consumers, and strategies for
11		increasing competition in the health insurance
12		field $[-,]$ and across the health care delivery system;
13	[(2)	Prepare and revise as necessary the state health
14		services and facilities plan.
15	(3)	Prepare, review, and revise the annual implementation
16		plan.]
17	[-(4)]	(2) Assist the statewide council in the performance
18		of its functions[-];
19	[(5)]	(3) Determine the need for new health services
20		proposed to be offered within the State[-];

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 $\left[\frac{(6)}{(4)}\right]$ (4) Assess existing health care services and 1 2 facilities to determine whether there are redundant, excessive, or inappropriate services or facilities and 3 make public findings of any that are found to be so. 4 The state agency shall weigh the costs of the health 5 care services or facilities against the benefits the 6 7 services or facilities provide and there shall be a negative presumption against marginal services[-]; 8 9 $\left[\frac{(7)}{(7)}\right]$ (5) Provide technical assistance to persons, public 10 or private, in obtaining and filling out the necessary forms for the development of projects and programs [-]; 11 12 $\left[\frac{(8)}{(8)}\right]$ (6) Prepare reports, studies, and recommendations on emerging health issues, such as medical ethics, health 13 care rationing, involuntary care, care for the 14 indigent, and standards for research and development 15 16 of biotechnology [and], genetic engineering[-], remote 17 monitoring, and artificial intelligence; and 18 [(9)] (7) Conduct such other activities as are necessary to 19 meet the purposes of this chapter."
