BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 387, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 Canceled shifts. (a) Each work day an employee "§387-
- 5 is required to report for work and reports, but is not assigned
- 6 work or is furnished less than half of the employee's usual or
- 7 scheduled day's work, the employee shall be paid for half the
- 8 usual or scheduled day's work; provided that the employee shall
- 9 receive not less than two hours and not more than four hours of
- 10 pay at the employee's regular rate; provided further that the
- 11 rate of pay shall be not less than the applicable minimum wage
- 12 pursuant to section 387-2.
- 13 (b) If an employee is required to report for work for a
- 14 second time in any one workday and is furnished less than two
- 15 hours of work on the second reporting, the employee shall be
- 16 paid for two hours at the employee's regular rate of pay;
