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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LAHAINA WILDFIRE RECOVERY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Maui wildfires
 destroyed more than two thousand homes and more than eight
 hundred places of business. Property damages have been
 estimated at \$6,000,000,000 and the lost business revenue has
 been estimated at \$2,700,000 per day. Recovery is expected to
 take five to ten years.

7 The legislature further finds that establishing a 8 commission to oversee the recovery process, understand the 9 entirety of the recovery, accept input from the public, and 10 provide a public-facing entity for recovery efforts will help to 11 ensure that the recovery efforts consider the needs of all 12 individuals involved.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a commission to provide a comprehensive and integrated vision of the 2023 Lahaina wildfire recovery. The legislature does not intend for this commission to take the place of regular information for the community and government, but instead

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1 provide a public-facing entity that will simultaneously gather
2 and disseminate information significant to the wildfire victims
3 and the State at-large, as recovery efforts proceed, and provide
4 a conduit through which community-initiated guidance on the
5 recovery efforts may be communicated to the public agencies
6 conducting the recovery, remediation, and restoration
7 activities.

8 SECTION 2. (a) There is established the Lahaina recovery 9 oversight commission within the department of accounting and 10 general services for administrative purposes. The purpose of 11 the Lahaina recovery oversight commission shall be to oversee, 12 report on, and guide the efforts taken to rebuild Lahaina, Maui, 13 from the damages caused by the 2023 wildfire.

14 (b) The commission shall consist of the following15 individuals:

16 (1) The senator who represents the senate district17 including Lahaina;

18 (2) The representative of the house of representatives who
19 represents the house district including Lahaina;
20 (3) The mayor of Maui county or the mayor's designee;

21 (4) An individual designated by the mayor of Maui county;



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1	(5)	Two members of the Maui county council, to be
2		designated by the Maui county council chair;
3	(6)	The superintendent of education, or the
4		superintendent's designee;
5	(7)	The comptroller, or the comptroller's designee;
6	(8)	The director of business, economic development, and
7		tourism, or the director's designee;
8	(9)	The state disaster recovery coordinator;
9	(10)	Three individuals designated by the speaker of the
10		house of representatives who were residents of
11		Lahaina, Maui, at the time of the 2023 Lahaina
12		wildfire event; and
13	(11)	Three individuals designated by the president of the
14		senate who were residents of Lahaina, Maui, at the
15		time of the 2023 Lahaina wildfire event.
16	(c)	The commission shall select a chair from among its
17	members.	The commission may establish working groups.
18	(d)	The commission shall invite members of the community,
19	relevant	for-profit and nonprofit entities, and relevant
20	federal,	state, and Maui county agencies and departments to
21	participa	ate in the public meetings of the commission.

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(e) The members of the commission shall serve without
 compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses, including
 reasonable travel expenses, necessary for the performance of
 their duties.

(f) No later than December 31, 2024, the commission shall establish standards for the recovery, including identifying relevant issues for analysis, establishing goals for rebuilding Lahaina, Maui, and drafting metrics to measure progress toward achieving the goals. The commission shall consult with the community and policy leaders in developing the standards and metrics required by this subsection.

(g) With the assistance of the office of enterprise technology services, the commission shall establish a website to serve as a clearinghouse for information related to the Lahaina wildfire recovery. The website shall also accept comments and other input from the public regarding the recovery.

17 (h) The commission's proceedings shall be subject to18 chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

19 (i) Not less than twenty days before the convening of the
20 2026, 2027, 2028, 2029, and 2030 regular sessions of the
21 legislature, the commission shall submit an annual report to the

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1 legislature on the following regarding the recovery of Lahaina, 2 Maui: 3 (1) The status of rebuilding housing, educational 4 facilities, and community facilities; 5 (2) The efforts taken for environmental restoration; 6 (3) The status of infrastructure restoration; 7 (4) Whether the well-being and other needs of impacted 8 Maui residents have been addressed; 9 (5) The progress toward reaching the goals established by 10 subsection (f); and 11 Findings, recommendations, and proposed legislation, (6) 12 if any. 13 The commission shall cease to exist on June 30, 2030. (†) 14 SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of 15 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and 16 37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined 17 that the appropriation contained in this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 18 19 to be exceeded by \$, or per cent. The reasons 20 for exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the

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appropriation made in this Act is necessary to serve the public 1 2 interest and to meet the needs provided for by this Act. 3 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for 6 the Lahaina recovery oversight commission. 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 8 accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.

9 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.
