## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC HEALTH AND MORALS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it has made
- 2 concerted efforts since the 2010s to reduce and combat sex
- 3 trafficking in the State and protect those victimized by
- 4 prostitution. One of these efforts was amending sections 712-
- 5 1202 and 712-1203, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to specifically
- 6 target those who benefit the most from prostitution, such as sex
- 7 traffickers and pimps.
- 8 The legislature finds that the Hawaii supreme court
- 9 decision in State v. Ibarra, 153 Hawai'i 50, 526 P.3d 575 (Haw.
- 10 2023), indicated a need for the sex trafficking and promoting
- 11 prostitution criminal offense statutes to be further clarified.
- 12 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to clarify the sex
- 13 trafficking and promoting prostitution criminal offense statutes
- 14 by:
- 15 (1) Clarifying the definition of "profits from
- prostitution";



1	(2)	inserting the definitions of "advances prostitution"
2		and "profits from prostitution" into the statutes
3		establishing the substantive offenses; and
4	(3)	Repealing section 712-1201, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
5		which is no longer needed after inserting its
6		definitions and exclusions directly into the
7		underlying substantive offenses.
8	SECT	ION 2. Section 712-1202, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended to read as follows:	
10	"§71	2-1202 Sex trafficking. (1) A person commits the
11	offense o	f sex trafficking if the person knowingly:
12	(a)	Advances prostitution by, or profits from prostitution
13		that is the result of another person, compelling or
14		inducing a person by force, threat, fraud, coercion,
15		or intimidation to engage in prostitution[, or profits
16		from such conduct by another]; or
17	(b)	Advances prostitution or profits from prostitution of
18		a minor.
19	(2)	Sex trafficking [is] shall be a class A felony.
20	(3)	As used in this section:

- "Advances prostitution" means that the person knowingly
  causes or aids another person to commit or engage in
- 3 prostitution, procures or solicits patrons for prostitution,
- 4 provides persons for prostitution purposes, permits premises to
- 5 be regularly used for prostitution purposes, operates or assists
- 6 in the operation of a house of prostitution or a prostitution
- 7 enterprise, or engages in any other conduct designed to
- 8 institute, aid, or facilitate an act or enterprise of
- 9 prostitution.
- "Fraud" means making material false statements,
- 11 misstatements, or omissions.
- 12 "Minor" means a person who is less than eighteen years of
- 13 age.
- 14 "Profits from prostitution" means that the person knowingly
- 15 accepts or receives money, anything of value, or other property
- 16 pursuant to an agreement or understanding with a third party
- 17 whereby the third party participates or is to participate in the
- 18 proceeds of prostitution activity, regardless of whether the
- 19 money, thing of value, or other property received is in excess
- 20 of expenditures related to the agreement or understanding or is
- 21 for reimbursement or repayment of debt.

- 1 "Threat" means any of the actions listed in section 707-
- **2** 764(1)...
- 3 (4) The state of mind requirement for the offense under
- 4 subsection (1)(b) is not applicable to the fact that the victim
- 5 was a minor. A person is strictly liable with respect to the
- 6 attendant circumstances that the victim was a minor.
- 7 (5) No person shall be convicted under this section if the
- 8 conduct of the person underlying the offense consists
- 9 exclusively of the person's own acts of:
- 10 (a) Prostitution as a prostituted person as provided in
- 11 section 712-1200; or
- 12 (b) Commercial sexual exploitation as provided in section
- 13 · 712-1200.5."
- 14 SECTION 3. Section 712-1203, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 "\$712-1203 Promoting prostitution. (1) A person commits
- 17 the offense of promoting prostitution if the person knowingly
- 18 advances prostitution or profits from prostitution.
- 19 (2) Promoting prostitution [is] shall be a class B felony.
- 20 (3) As used in this section:

- 3 prostitution, procures or solicits patrons for prostitution,
- 4 provides persons for prostitution purposes, permits premises to
- 5 be regularly used for prostitution purposes, operates or assists
- 6 in the operation of a house of prostitution or a prostitution
- 7 enterprise, or engages in any other conduct designed to
- 8 institute, aid, or facilitate an act or enterprise of
- 9 prostitution.
- 10 "Profits from prostitution" means that the person knowingly
- 11 accepts or receives money, anything of value, or other property
- 12 pursuant to an agreement or understanding with a third party
- 13 whereby the third party participates or is to participate in the
- 14 proceeds of prostitution activity, regardless of whether the
- 15 money, thing of value, or other property received is in excess
- 16 of expenditures related to the agreement or understanding or is

- 18 (4) No person shall be convicted under this section if the

- 20 exclusively of the person's own acts of:

- 1 (a) Prostitution as a prostituted person as provided in
- <u>section 712-1200; or</u>
- 3 (b) Commercial sexual exploitation as provided in section
- 4 712-1200.5."
- 5 SECTION 4. Section 712-1206, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 1. By amending subsection (1) to read:
- 8 "(1) For the purposes of this section[, "public]:
- 9 "Advancing prostitution" means that the person knowingly
- 10 causes or aids another person to commit or engage in
- 11 prostitution, procures or solicits patrons for prostitution,
- 12 provides persons for prostitution purposes, permits premises to
- 13 be regularly used for prostitution purposes, operates or assists
- 14 in the operation of a house of prostitution or a prostitution
- 15 enterprise, or engages in any other conduct designed to
- 16 institute, aid, or facilitate an act or enterprise of
- 17 prostitution.
- 18 "Public place" means any street, sidewalk, bridge, alley or
- 19 alleyway, plaza, park, driveway, parking lot or transportation
- 20 facility or the doorways and entrance ways to any building

[which] that fronts on any of the aforesaid places, or a motor 2 vehicle in or on any such place." 2. By amending subsection (3) to read: 3 4 "(3) Any person who remains or wanders about in a public 5 place and repeatedly beckons to, or repeatedly stops, or 6 repeatedly attempts to engage passers-by in conversation, or 7 repeatedly stops or attempts to stop motor vehicles, or 8 repeatedly interferes with the free passage of other persons for 9 the purpose of committing the crime of advancing prostitution 10 [as that term is defined in section 712-1201(1) is] shall be 11 quilty of a petty misdemeanor." 12 SECTION 5. Section 712-1201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 repealed. 14 ["\$712-1201 Advancing prostitution; profiting from 15 prostitution; definition of terms. 12	<del>(3)</del>	The definitions in subsections (1) and (2) shall not
13		include those engaged in conduct outlined in section
14		712-1200 as the prostituted person or section 712-
15		1200.5 as the person engaged in commercial sexual
16		exploitation."]
17	SECT	ION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
18	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.	
19	SECT	ION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.

## Report Title:

Penal Code; Offenses Against Public Health and Morals; Sex Trafficking; Promoting Prostitution

## Description:

Clarifies the definition of "profits from prostitution" to include money or property received regardless of expenditures or if it was a reimbursement or repayment of a debt. Amends the sex trafficking and promoting prostitution criminal offense statutes by inserting relevant definitions in those statutes and repealing a statute that is no longer needed. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)
